 2 (10.00 am)  
 3 THE CHIEF CORONER: Good morning.  
 4 MR HOUGH: Just before Mr Jolley continues his evidence, may  
 5 I make a short announcement. There have been two  
 6 applications in relation to special measures which the  
 7 court will address after court next Tuesday.  
 8 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes.  
 9 MR HOUGH: One is an application for anonymity and special  
 10 measures, that's to say screening, by a person we're  
 11 referring to as SB, who is a friend of Youssef Zaghba's.  
 12 The second application is an application for special  
 13 measures, screening only, by Khuram Butt's sister,  
 14 Haleema Butt.  
 15 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes.  
 16 MR HOUGH: We've circulated those applications to all  
 17 interested persons, they can also be made available to  
 18 the media and they will be considered, as I say, after  
 19 court on Tuesday.  
 20 THE CHIEF CORONER: Thank you.  
 21 DCI WAYNE JOLLEY (continued)  
 22 Questions by MR HOUGH QC (continued)  
 23 MR HOUGH: Mr Jolley, you naturally remain under oath. You  
 24 told us yesterday about the investigative work of your  
 25 team concerning the lives and backgrounds of the

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1 attackers and you summarised a huge amount of  
 2 investigative work over the course of yesterday.  
 3 A. That's correct, sir.  
 4 Q. I'm now going to ask you about work done by your team to  
 5 investigate the attackers' preparations for their attack  
 6 based on the inquiries you made after the attack. You  
 7 made a report on this subject, which is reference  
 8 {DC5021}.  
 9 First of all, can I ask you about contact between  
 10 the attackers in the months before the attack. Now,  
 11 this will be covered in more detail by DS Ager, you're  
 12 aware, but the basic facts, please, first of all.  
 13 By what time can we say with confidence that all the  
 14 attackers were in contact with each other?  
 15 A. Sir, with confidence we can say that they were all in  
 16 contact with each other by 14 January 2017.  
 17 Q. Prior to that, I think there are communications data  
 18 indicating contact between Khuram Butt and  
 19 Rachid Redouane going back to December 2016; is that  
 20 right?  
 21 A. That's correct, sir.  
 22 Q. But is this also right: that because some communications  
 23 made by Khuram Butt were with the messaging app  
 24 WhatsApp, which has encryption, some communications data  
 25 may not have been obtained?

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1 A. That's correct.  
 2 Q. You've already given us some information about the  
 3 contact between the attackers in your evidence  
 4 yesterday, regular contact at the Ummah Fitness Centre,  
 5 the trip to Leeds involving Khuram Butt and  
 6 Rachid Redouane, the trip to Southend involving Redouane  
 7 and Zaghba, and the swimming trips involving all three  
 8 to Stratford on Sundays; yes?  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. Is this right also: that inquiries indicated that the  
 11 three men met, along with others, at the Ummah Fitness  
 12 Centre on 7 March 2017?  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. And also that there was a separate meeting on the same  
 15 day of several people at Khuram Butt's block, which was  
 16 attended by Redouane and possibly also by Zaghba?  
 17 A. That's correct.  
 18 Q. May we look, please, at {DC8172/3}. Can we see there  
 19 some CCTV stills from 7 March 2017 showing Redouane  
 20 being let into Elizabeth Fry Apartments by Khuram Butt?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. And that is at 5.13 in the evening, and then page 7 of  
 23 the same document, please {DC8172/7}, can we see there  
 24 in the top image a man regarded as similar to Zaghba  
 25 arriving and entering at 17.33, just after 5.30?

1 A. Yes, sir, that's our assessment that that is  
 2 Youssef Zaghba.  
 3 Q. We can take that off screen. Is it also right that the  
 4 police obtained a photograph from the barbecue which was  
 5 held on 14 May 2017, so two or three weeks before the  
 6 attack, which was to celebrate the birth of  
 7 Khuram Butt's second child?  
 8 A. Yes, sir.  
 9 Q. That photograph, I think, had been posted by Khuram Butt  
 10 on a WhatsApp chat?  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. If we look, please, at {DC8191/1}, I think, we can see  
 13 the photograph there showing a number of men in the  
 14 garden behind the apartments of Butt's block, praying,  
 15 seen from the rear.  
 16 A. That's correct.  
 17 Q. And if we go to {DC8191/9} of the same document, I think  
 18 you were able to identify most of those present with  
 19 some confidence?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Is this right: they included various family members and  
 22 friends of Khuram Butt?  
 23 A. Yes, sir.  
 24 Q. And can we see circled on this image, Rachid Redouane  
 25 was present wearing, again, that distinctive red and

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1 blue top we saw on the image from 7 March?  
 2 A. Yes, sir.  
 3 Q. So we can take that down now.  
 4 May I now move to the purchase of the knives used in  
 5 the attack. As the court has heard, each of the  
 6 attackers was armed with a pink knife?  
 7 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 8 Q. I think each of those was a 12-inch ceramic knife with  
 9 the brand name Ernesto?  
 10 A. Yes, sir.  
 11 Q. Did your inquiries tell you where those knives had been  
 12 bought?  
 13 A. Yes, sir, they did. They were purchased from Lidl.  
 14 Q. And that was Lidl in East Ham, I think?  
 15 A. Yes, sir.  
 16 Q. At what date and time were they purchased?  
 17 A. They were purchased on 15 May 2017 at about 22.15 hours.  
 18 Q. Can we put on screen, please {DC7823/5}. Sorry,  
 19 {DC7283/5}, I gave the wrong reference. Do we see there  
 20 the location of Lidl quite close to Rachid Redouane's  
 21 flat on Barking Road?  
 22 A. Yes, you can sir. As you can see, he's still wearing  
 23 the same jacket.  
 24 Q. Yes, and in the inset clip he is shown buying the knives  
 25 dressed in that same jacket. We'll look at footage of

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1 that purchase shortly. We can take that off screen now.  
 2 Moving on to your report, page 6, did you also  
 3 discover, based on CCTV material, that the attackers had  
 4 had a meeting in the early hours of 29 May 2017, so five  
 5 days before the attack, at the Ummah Fitness Centre?  
 6 A. That's correct, sir.  
 7 Q. Looking at paragraph 4.4 of your report, during that  
 8 meeting, did Redouane do something notable which  
 9 suggested that he was avoiding potential surveillance?  
 10 A. Yes, Redouane places his phone on a crate which was  
 11 situated outside the entrance to Ummah Fitness gym.  
 12 Q. After he had done that, did you discover from CCTV that  
 13 the attackers walked along a nearby street in  
 14 conversation with each other, stayed there for a time  
 15 and then returned via the Ummah Fitness Centre?  
 16 A. That's right, sir. They walk into St Luke's Avenue  
 17 which is actually where the entrance to Ummah Fitness  
 18 gym is.  
 19 Q. If we look at {DC7283/7}, we can see here a map which  
 20 shows the location of the Ummah Fitness Centre at the  
 21 top right of the page and the locations of the three  
 22 attackers' home addresses, and as we can see, the gym  
 23 was quite close to both Butt's and Zaghba's home  
 24 addresses?  
 25 A. That's correct.

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1 Q. Redouane's a little further away but, still, not a very  
 2 long distance away?  
 3 A. That's correct, sir.  
 4 Q. And we see two of the images from the CCTV you were  
 5 referring to inset and on the page.  
 6 A. That's correct.  
 7 Q. We can take that off the screen now.  
 8 Were you also able to identify from CCTV -- and  
 9 I'm now looking at page 10 of your report -- a further  
 10 meeting on 2 June 2017, the day before the attack,  
 11 involving Redouane and Zaghba and possibly involving  
 12 Butt?  
 13 A. Yes, sir, we can definitely say that Redouane and Zaghba  
 14 were together because there's CCTV of that, and a few  
 15 minutes later, I think it's approximately 10 minutes  
 16 later, Khuram Butt enters Ummah Fitness Centre.  
 17 Q. We can put on screen {DC7283/11}, please. Can we see  
 18 here once again the home addresses of the three  
 19 attackers and the gym, but also this time inset two  
 20 images from 2 June?  
 21 A. That's correct.  
 22 Q. And do we see from the left hand of those images a still  
 23 showing Redouane and Zaghba walking together past the  
 24 Ummah Fitness Centre at 10.12 at night?  
 25 A. That's correct.

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1 Q. And then within 10 minutes of that, at just after 10.20,  
 2 Khuram Butt is seen entering the Ummah Fitness Centre on  
 3 another CCTV still?  
 4 A. That's correct.  
 5 Q. You told us yesterday that Zahrah Rehman told your team  
 6 that Khuram Butt had gone out that night after having  
 7 dinner at home, so it's possible that after doing that  
 8 he went for a meeting with the other attackers?  
 9 A. Absolutely possible, yes.  
 10 Q. We can take that off screen now.  
 11 May I now move to the making of the incendiary  
 12 devices, which you deal with from page 12 of your  
 13 report. Is it right to say that after the attack, some  
 14 bottles were discovered in the passenger footwell of the  
 15 van which appeared to be makeshift incendiary devices?  
 16 A. That's correct, sir, 13 of them.  
 17 Q. Were they wine bottles from the brand Baywood Rose, or  
 18 Rosé?  
 19 A. That's correct.  
 20 Q. If we put on the screen, please, {DC5021/14}, can we see  
 21 how those bottles were found? Some in the footwell,  
 22 some just spilled out of it after the van had crashed?  
 23 A. That's correct.  
 24 Q. Did each of those bottles have a wick, or an apparent  
 25 wick, around the neck?

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1 A. Yes, sir, they did.  
 2 Q. That was, I think, in the form of some fabric material  
 3 tied around?  
 4 A. That's correct.  
 5 Q. What was found inside them?  
 6 A. So in most of the bottles other than one of them there  
 7 was -- the upper layer was petrol and the lower layer  
 8 being aqueous, mildly acidic, containing ethanol.  
 9 Q. The other one?  
 10 A. The other bottle contained heavy petroleum distillate,  
 11 HPD, rather than petrol in the upper layer.  
 12 Q. So they all had some form of petroleum liquid inside  
 13 them?  
 14 A. Yes, sir.  
 15 Q. What conclusion was reached about whether they could be  
 16 viable as petrol bombs?  
 17 A. The conclusion was that they were viable.  
 18 Q. I think it depended on whether the wick on each one  
 19 would have sustained a flame?  
 20 A. That's correct, sir.  
 21 Q. Looking at 5.3 of your report, did you also find in the  
 22 front of the van items used or intended to be used to  
 23 light the devices?  
 24 A. Yes, sir, there were two blowtorches, one of which had  
 25 the name, branding name "GoSystem". Both canisters were

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1 labelled as "butane propane mix".  
 2 Q. Did you make inquiries to discover when the wine bottles  
 3 had been bought and where?  
 4 A. Yes, we did.  
 5 Q. Looking at paragraph 5 of your report, what was the --  
 6 5.5 of your report, what was the result of those  
 7 inquiries?  
 8 A. The wine bottles were purchased on 30 May at the same  
 9 Lidl as the knives had been purchased by Redouane.  
 10 Q. Can we put on the screen, please {DC7283/9}. Do we see  
 11 there once again a map indicating the proximity of  
 12 Redouane's address to Lidl in East Ham, and then inset  
 13 an image from 30 May at just before 10.00 pm, showing  
 14 Redouane purchasing the wine bottles?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. We can take that off screen.  
 17 Looking now at 5.7 to 5.8 of your report on page 16,  
 18 when Rachid Redouane's home address was searched, was  
 19 anything discovered which appeared to be connected to  
 20 the making of these devices?  
 21 A. Yes, sir, there were segments of clothing found during  
 22 the search of his home address and that clothing matched  
 23 the wicks that were found in the bottles.  
 24 Q. Was anything found at the home address otherwise  
 25 involved with the making of these devices?

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1 A. Yes, sir, there was also two 5-litre bottles containing  
 2 a small amount of fuel-type fluid, and a GoSystem manual  
 3 for the torch.  
 4 Q. Thank you very much. May we now turn to the making of  
 5 the mock explosive belts. The court has heard that each  
 6 of the attackers was wearing a mock suicide vest at the  
 7 time of the attack. May we please bring up {PH0150/11}.  
 8 This is an example of one of the suicide vests, I think.  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. Looking at paragraph 6.2 of your report, what was the  
 11 composition of these belts found to be after the attack?  
 12 A. All of the belts consisted of four bottles covered in  
 13 silver and black tape attached to a brown belt. I think  
 14 it is also important to point out that the bottles  
 15 didn't contain any liquid.  
 16 Q. Look at page 19 of your report and paragraphs 6.3 to  
 17 6.5, were DNA tests made on material from the belts to  
 18 identify who had been in contact with them?  
 19 A. Yes, the extensive forensic work was carried out around  
 20 all of the belts that were seized.  
 21 Q. What was the result of that forensic work?  
 22 A. Each of the vests had traces of DNA from the respective  
 23 wearer on the outer surface, but a complete DNA profile  
 24 for Redouane was identified on all three of the belts.  
 25 Q. So that suggested, did it, that Redouane had had some

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1 part in putting together the three belts, or putting  
 2 them on?  
 3 A. That would be the assumption, yes, sir.  
 4 Q. In particular, was DNA from Redouane discovered on the  
 5 inside surfaces of the bottle caps?  
 6 A. Yes, it was.  
 7 Q. So suggesting that he may have emptied the bottles and  
 8 was likely involved in the actual construction of the  
 9 belts?  
 10 A. Yes, sir.  
 11 Q. Were traces of DNA from Zaghba also found on the inside  
 12 of the bottle caps?  
 13 A. Yes, they were.  
 14 Q. Again, suggesting that he may have been involved in  
 15 constructing two of the belts?  
 16 A. Yes.  
 17 Q. Finally, did you find at Redouane's home any other  
 18 material used, apparently, in the construction of these  
 19 belts?  
 20 A. Yes, as you can see from the photo there is some silver  
 21 and black tape that's been used in the construction.  
 22 Tape of similar appearance was seized at the address.  
 23 Q. So some evidence suggesting that Redouane, perhaps with  
 24 assistance from Zaghba, may have made these belts,  
 25 possibly at his home?

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1 A. Yes, sir, important to add as well that there were no  
 2 other DNA traces obtained from the examination of those  
 3 items.  
 4 Q. And no items obtained from Khuram Butt's flat or  
 5 Zaghba's flat suggesting that these items or any of the  
 6 other items were made there?  
 7 A. That's correct.  
 8 Q. May we move on to the hiring of the van. We can take  
 9 that document off screen.  
 10 Now, you have told us that on the afternoon of the  
 11 attack, Khuram Butt approached a neighbour outside his  
 12 block and asked him about hiring a van, that  
 13 was Habibur Murad, and I think we see the exchange on  
 14 CCTV between 4.00 and 4.30 pm?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. Once again, as you indicated yesterday, is it right that  
 17 your inquiries didn't reveal any suggestion that Murad  
 18 had anything to do with the attack?  
 19 A. That's correct, sir, nothing at all.  
 20 Q. Did Khuram Butt ask Murad if he had any access to a van  
 21 to lend to Butt because Butt needed to help with a house  
 22 move?  
 23 A. That's correct. I think Butt had told him he needed to  
 24 "move a brother".  
 25 Q. Did Murad respond to that that he didn't have access to

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1 a van?  
 2 A. Yes, he did, and Murad had suggested contacting  
 3 a company by the name of Enterprise.  
 4 Q. Was it after that exchange that Khuram Butt asked Murad  
 5 to transfer the sum of £160 to his account in return for  
 6 the same sum in cash in order to facilitate the hiring?  
 7 A. Yes, sir, as I mentioned yesterday, because Butt didn't  
 8 have sufficient funds in his account to make the online  
 9 payment so he asked Murad to transfer the money into his  
 10 account in exchange for the cash.  
 11 Q. After that exchange, shortly after 4 o'clock on the day  
 12 of the attack, did Khuram Butt then make an online  
 13 booking to hire a van?  
 14 A. Yes, he did.  
 15 Q. Was that with Hertz?  
 16 A. Yes, it was.  
 17 Q. If we put on screen, please {WS0727/10}, please. Try  
 18 another reference. {WS0272/10}. It should be a ...  
 19 The reference is right but the wrong document is  
 20 coming up. It must be an error on the system.  
 21 Ah, there is a duplicate reference. It's just being  
 22 sorted. I should say, Mr Jolley, it's normally my  
 23 mistake rather than Opus.  
 24 (Pause).  
 25 Apparently it can't be found. We'll come back to it

1 if necessary. Can I put it in this way: did your team  
 2 find a booking form, an online booking form, showing  
 3 that Khuram Butt made a booking at 16.34 on the day of  
 4 the attack -- ah, we have it. {WS0727/10}. Do we see  
 5 here the online booking form showing that Khuram Butt  
 6 made a booking at 16.34 giving a mobile number ending  
 7 666?  
 8 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 9 Q. Can we see at the bottom that he made a prepayment of  
 10 £70 with a Visa card?  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. Can we also see towards the bottom of the page the  
 13 arrangement was for collection of the van from a B&Q in  
 14 Romford?  
 15 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 16 Q. Was the original arrangement for the van to be hired  
 17 from 5.30 pm to 8.30 pm.  
 18 A. Yes, it was.  
 19 Q. I think we can see that if we can move to page 5 of the  
 20 same document, if that's possible {WS0727/5}. We can  
 21 see an extract from a statement of Mr Donovan of Hertz  
 22 saying that the booking was created from 5.30 pm to  
 23 8.30 pm. We can take that off the screen now.  
 24 Is this right, that the system was that on booking  
 25 the van, the customer would receive a PIN number which

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1 would give access to the van at a collection location?  
 2 A. That's correct, sir.  
 3 Q. Was the booking later extended to 10.00 am the next day  
 4 as a result of calls made by Khuram Butt shortly after  
 5 5.30 on the afternoon of the attack?  
 6 A. Yes, sir.  
 7 Q. The phone with the number ending 666, was that a phone  
 8 that was found after the attack in the van?  
 9 A. Yes, sir, that's the phone that was found in the front  
 10 passenger footwell.  
 11 Q. Had that phone been used to only a limited extent?  
 12 A. Yes, it had.  
 13 Q. May we please put up on screen {DC5021/21}. Can we see  
 14 here a page from your report in which you've prepared  
 15 a table of calls made with this particular mobile phone?  
 16 A. Yes, sir.  
 17 Q. Can we see from that that between 3.50 and 4.34 on the  
 18 day of the attack there are a series of calls made to  
 19 hire companies, a whole range of hire companies?  
 20 A. Yes, sir.  
 21 Q. So this shows that before Khuram Butt made the booking  
 22 with Hertz, he had apparently tried a number of other  
 23 hire companies?  
 24 A. That's correct.  
 25 Q. And in particular, looking at paragraph 7.8 of your

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1 report, did one of these calls establish contact with  
 2 a company called S&J Self-Drive Hire?  
 3 A. Yes, they did.  
 4 Q. May we try another reference on the screen, please  
 5 {WS0157/2}. Did your team obtain an online booking  
 6 which Khuram Butt had made on the day of the attack with  
 7 a view to hiring a large vehicle?  
 8 A. Yes, sir. It was a 7.5-tonne lorry.  
 9 Q. We see that at around the middle of the page, vehicle  
 10 Iveco 75E16, and that's a 7.5-tonne lorry?  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. Was that van ever collected?  
 13 A. No, sir, it was never collected, and it's our assessment  
 14 it was likely because the branch at which he had  
 15 requested to collect it from had closed at 11.00 am that  
 16 morning.  
 17 Q. So that's the likely explanation for why he couldn't get  
 18 the much larger vehicle which he had attempted to book  
 19 by that means?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. We can take that off screen now.  
 22 May we now move to the movements of the attackers on  
 23 the day of the attack. Is this right: using CCTV, which  
 24 we'll see, it was possible for your team to piece  
 25 together the movements of the attackers on the day?

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1 A. That's correct, sir.  
 2 Q. But is this right: some gaps still remain despite of all  
 3 that work?  
 4 A. Yes, sir.  
 5 Q. And what I propose to do is to go through a brief  
 6 summary of those movements before we move to the audio  
 7 visual compilation which shows the CCTV clips.  
 8 So, looking, first, at paragraph 8.1 of the report,  
 9 your evidence yesterday was that Butt and his wife and  
 10 family had gone walking in a park near their house  
 11 shortly before or around midday on the day of the  
 12 attack?  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. Did you find CCTV footage showing Butt going with his  
 15 child to a cash point in Barking, apparently shortly  
 16 after that walk?  
 17 A. Yes, sir. The cash machine was outside the Asda, Genoa  
 18 Buildings, in Barking.  
 19 Q. Was that appearance timed at just before midday, 11.58?  
 20 A. Yes, it was.  
 21 Q. Moving on chronologically, did you then obtain footage  
 22 showing Rachid Redouane arriving at Charisse O'Leary's  
 23 address, the Barking & Dagenham Foyer, just before  
 24 1.00 pm, 12.59?  
 25 A. Yes, we did.

1 Q. Did you also find from that CCTV evidence showing, as  
 2 she said, that she left to attend a family barbecue  
 3 shortly after he arrived?  
 4 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 5 Q. Leaving him with their child?  
 6 A. Yes.  
 7 Q. Did you find from the footage that he remained at the  
 8 address until shortly after 2.00 pm?  
 9 A. Yes, he did.  
 10 Q. And did you find that at 2.04 pm, Khuram Butt arrived at  
 11 the block and a few minutes later he left with Redouane  
 12 and the child?  
 13 A. That's correct, sir. They all left together.  
 14 Q. Paragraph 8.4, did you find that about an hour and  
 15 a half later, shortly after 3.30 pm, Redouane returned  
 16 briefly to the same block?  
 17 A. Yes, we did.  
 18 Q. Before then driving away in the red Corsa registered to  
 19 Butt?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Paragraph 8.5, did you then find that at around 4.00 pm  
 22 Khuram Butt was outside his home address with the red  
 23 Corsa?  
 24 A. Yes, we did, sir, corresponding with the conversation he  
 25 had with Habibur Murad at that time.

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1 Q. So we will see, I think, between 4.00 and 4.30, Butt in  
 2 conversation with Murad outside the block?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. And Butt also making some phone calls and web searches  
 5 apparently on his phone which are consistent with the  
 6 pattern of him trying to book vehicles as we saw?  
 7 A. Absolutely.  
 8 Q. Did you discern from the CCTV that during that period,  
 9 so 4.00 to 4.30, all three attackers were in and around  
 10 the Corsa outside Khuram Butt's block?  
 11 A. We did.  
 12 Q. Paragraph 8.6, did you find evidence of a further  
 13 movement of the Corsa shortly after 5.00 pm?  
 14 A. Yes, we did sir, around 17.15 hours, 17.17 hours, the  
 15 red Corsa arrived at the B&Q in Harold Hill where the  
 16 booking for the Hertz van had been made.  
 17 Q. During the time at B&Q, did Khuram Butt attempt to  
 18 collect the Hertz van using a PIN number?  
 19 A. Yes, he did.  
 20 Q. Did he, while there, call Hertz, making two calls to  
 21 complain about not being able to get access to the van?  
 22 A. Yes, he did.  
 23 Q. During one of those calls which lasted, I think, about  
 24 13 minutes, did he ask to have the van for longer than  
 25 three hours, once again, saying that he needed it for

1 helping a friend move house?  
 2 A. Yes, he did, and I believe that time extension was  
 3 authorised.  
 4 Q. That was, I think, to 10.00 am the next day?  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. While at B&Q, did any of the attackers, shortly before  
 7 6 o'clock, go into the store to make some purchases?  
 8 A. Yes, sir. Redouane entered the store and made some  
 9 purchases of gravel.  
 10 Q. Did Butt also separately go into the store and make  
 11 similar purchases?  
 12 A. Yes, he did.  
 13 Q. If we can put on the screen, please, {PH0181/1}. This  
 14 is an image of the van in situ at the collision site.  
 15 Can we see at the end of the loading compartment towards  
 16 the seats there's a number of bags of gravel and ballast  
 17 with some plastic chairs on top of them?  
 18 A. Yes, sir, there's 29 bags of gravel in total, I believe,  
 19 and they're the chairs that were mentioned yesterday.  
 20 Q. If we look, please, at {PH0278/1} we can see here,  
 21 I think, the sheer number of bags of gravel which were  
 22 found in the back of the van.  
 23 A. That's correct.  
 24 Q. Did your team conclude that one possible use of this  
 25 gravel was to add weight to the van?

21

1 A. Yes, it was a possibility.  
 2 Q. That is, I think, a technique which has been recommended  
 3 in some extremist publications for vehicle-as-weapon  
 4 attacks?  
 5 A. Yes, I believe it has.  
 6 Q. We can take that off screen now.  
 7 Looking now at paragraph 8.7 of your report, can you  
 8 tell us when the van left B&Q?  
 9 A. Yes, at 18.34 hours on the CCTV that we recovered we can  
 10 identify the van leaving B&Q in convoy with the Corsa.  
 11 Q. Who were in the two vehicles and who driving them?  
 12 A. CCTV indicates that Butt was a front seat passenger and  
 13 the likelihood that Zaghba was driving, and then --  
 14 Q. That's the van?  
 15 A. Sorry, Zaghba was driving the van, yes, sir, and  
 16 Redouane more likely to be driving the Corsa as that  
 17 went straight back to Wakering Road.  
 18 Q. We can put on screen, please {DC7283/15}. Now, is this  
 19 right: that you were able to plot the movement of the  
 20 van by using, amongst other things, GPS equipment?  
 21 A. Yes, sir, the van was fitted with GPS equipment and we  
 22 were able to recover that and identify the most likely  
 23 route that they took back to the address.  
 24 Q. And when you say the most likely route you work out from  
 25 GPS equipment, is this right: that you use the GPS

22

1 equipment to get a series of points along the route and  
 2 then you reconstruct the route from those points?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. Can we see here on screen that you have reconstructed  
 5 a route for the van based on GPS signals indicating that  
 6 it left the B&Q at 18.34 and arrived at Zaghba's home  
 7 address at 19.17, 7.17?  
 8 A. That's correct, sir.  
 9 Q. Meanwhile, is this right, 8.9 of your report, that  
 10 Rachid Redouane drove his Corsa back to Charisse  
 11 O'Leary's apartment building, the Barking & Dagenham  
 12 Foyer?  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. Did he arrive there at 19.12 and leave at 19.16, so  
 15 staying only a short time?  
 16 A. Yes, I believe Charisse O'Leary came back whilst he was  
 17 parking up the vehicle.  
 18 Q. And this I think was the occasion when she said that she  
 19 collected the child and Redouane said that the child was  
 20 wet and hadn't been fed?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. Looking at paragraph 8.10 of your report, the Corsa,  
 23 where was that found after the attack?  
 24 A. The Corsa was found outside Zaghba's address at 43  
 25 Fairfield Road.

23

1 Q. So does that suggest that Redouane, after dropping off  
 2 the child, drove to Zaghba's address and linked up there  
 3 with Butt and Zaghba?  
 4 A. Yes, it does.  
 5 Q. Can we put on screen, now, {DC7283/19}. Were you able,  
 6 I'm now looking at paragraph 8.11 of your report, to  
 7 identify the next journey of the van?  
 8 A. Yes, sir. It left Fairfield Road between 19.38 hours  
 9 and 19.47 and travelled in a relatively direct route  
 10 towards a Shell petrol station.  
 11 Q. So based on the GPS data you could tell that the van's  
 12 ignition had been turned on at 19.38 and that it was  
 13 seen a short distance away, or placed a short distance  
 14 away, at 19.47?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. But it then travelled to a Shell petrol station by what  
 17 appears to be a reasonably direct route?  
 18 A. Yes, sir.  
 19 Q. And we can see this route on the plan?  
 20 A. We can.  
 21 Q. Based on the footage, were all of the attackers now in  
 22 the van?  
 23 A. Yes, they were.  
 24 Q. So likely that they rendez-voused about 7.30 that  
 25 evening?

24

1 A. Yes, at Zaghba's address.  
 2 Q. What time did the van arrive at the Shell petrol station  
 3 in Barking?  
 4 A. 19.54 hours, sir.  
 5 Q. Where were the attackers in the front seats at that  
 6 time?  
 7 A. Zaghba was the driver of the van, Redouane was in the  
 8 middle, and Butt was in the passenger seat next to the  
 9 window.  
 10 Q. What did they purchase at the Shell shop?  
 11 A. They purchased £57.90 worth of diesel, also some drinks  
 12 and snack bars and the van left the petrol station at  
 13 20.03 hours.  
 14 Q. They filled the van with a certain amount of fuel and  
 15 they then set off at just after 8.00 pm.  
 16 Looking at paragraph 8.13, where did the attackers  
 17 go from there?  
 18 A. They turned left out of the petrol station and then they  
 19 went towards Butt's home address.  
 20 Q. Can we look, please, at page {DC7283/21}, and can we see  
 21 here one possible route from the Shell petrol station to  
 22 a further location identified on the GPS where it was  
 23 identified at 8.20 that evening?  
 24 A. Yes, I think it's important for me to point out,  
 25 actually, that when they came out of the petrol station

25

1 they turned left and then they do an U-turn on  
 2 Cowbridge Lane whereby they are stationary for about  
 3 10 minutes without the ignition being turned off, prior  
 4 to going to Elizabeth Fry Court.  
 5 Q. So there's a two-stage journey: there's a first journey  
 6 from 8.03 to 8.20 to a location where they remained  
 7 stationary for 10 minutes. I think that's the  
 8 10 minutes before 8.20?  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. And then next page, please {DC7283/22}. Do we then see  
 11 that there was a second stage to the journey. After  
 12 they'd been stationary for 10 minutes they set off at  
 13 8.20 and travel the short distance to Butt's block,  
 14 Elizabeth Fry Apartments, arriving there at 8.25?  
 15 A. That's correct, sir, and that route is taken due to  
 16 one-way roads and one-way streets.  
 17 Q. So does the two-stage journey suggest perhaps that the  
 18 van was driven to an out-of-the-way location and some  
 19 sort of preparation made there?  
 20 A. That's a possibility, sir.  
 21 Q. Did you however obtain any CCTV footage of what was  
 22 being done in that location?  
 23 A. No, we didn't.  
 24 Q. We can take that off the screen now. Was the van then  
 25 outside Khuram Butt's block for a time?

26

1 A. Yes, it was.  
 2 Q. Paragraph 8.14. What period?  
 3 A. So it was outside his block between 20.25 hours and  
 4 20.55 hours.  
 5 Q. While there, what were the attackers seen to do?  
 6 A. They were seen to load the chairs into the rear of the  
 7 van that were described yesterday.  
 8 Q. And those were the black plastic chairs that were later  
 9 found inside, as we saw on the photograph earlier?  
 10 A. That's correct.  
 11 Q. Were those involved in the loading principally Butt and  
 12 Redouane?  
 13 A. Yes.  
 14 Q. Did Butt also load in the red suitcase that we saw in  
 15 the back of the van a few moments ago?  
 16 A. Yes, he did.  
 17 Q. Did the van then set off from the Barking area at 20.55?  
 18 A. Yes, it did.  
 19 Q. From there did it travel towards central London?  
 20 A. Yes, it did, entering the City at Aldgate at  
 21 21.32 hours.  
 22 Q. Now may we just use a few plans to identify the route  
 23 taken by the van as constructed using the GPS material.  
 24 First of all, {DC7283/25}. Can we see from this  
 25 plan that the van initially headed north from Butt's

27

1 block, and at first overshot the junction with the A12?  
 2 A. Yes, it does.  
 3 Q. Next page, please. Can we then see that the van was  
 4 turned around at a roundabout, driven back to the A12  
 5 junction and then headed west on the A12?  
 6 A. That's correct.  
 7 Q. Can we also see that the van left the A12 at the Bow  
 8 Flyover, joining the A11?  
 9 A. Correct.  
 10 Q. Then page 27, please of the same document {DC7283/27}.  
 11 Can we see that the van continued down the A11, the  
 12 Whitechapel Road, and that it was seen entering the City  
 13 at Aldgate, at you've told us, at 21.32.  
 14 A. That's correct, sir.  
 15 Q. And then travelling down Fenchurch Street going west?  
 16 A. That's correct.  
 17 Q. Then the next page, please {DC7283/28}. Can we see from  
 18 this plan that the van took a rather circuitous path  
 19 around the City?  
 20 A. Yes, it did.  
 21 Q. Was its route first of all following the red-lined path  
 22 to Fenchurch Avenue?  
 23 A. Yes, it was.  
 24 Q. Then the blue-lined route on the plan going east up  
 25 Fenchurch Street, then west along Leadenhall Street, and

28



1 south down Gracechurch Street?  
 2 A. That's correct.  
 3 Q. Next, page 32, please {DC7283/32}. Did the GPS and now  
 4 CCTV material show the van heading south into King  
 5 William Street towards London Bridge?  
 6 A. Yes, sir.  
 7 Q. And going south across London Bridge?  
 8 A. That's correct.  
 9 Q. Do we see from the inset CCTV images that the time was  
 10 now between 21.58 and 22.00 hours, so around 10.00 pm?  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. Then next page, please {DC7283/33}. Do we see now the  
 13 van shown on a further series of CCTV cameras travelled  
 14 south down Borough High Street?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. Turned round, possibly at the junction with Marshalsea  
 17 Road?  
 18 A. Yes.  
 19 Q. And then headed back north?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Can we see from the various inset images that this part  
 22 of the journey was from 10.00 pm to 10.04?  
 23 A. We can, yes.  
 24 Q. And then page 34, please {DC7283/34}. Can we see  
 25 finally that the van went north over London Bridge?

29

1 A. Yes.  
 2 Q. Turned around near Monument station.  
 3 A. That's correct.  
 4 Q. Before travelling south, again, over the bridge?  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. And was it on this second pass south over the bridge  
 7 that the attack began?  
 8 A. That's correct, sir.  
 9 Q. As we've already heard, the first mounting of the kerb  
 10 took place at 22.06.51?  
 11 A. That's correct, sir.  
 12 Q. Now, is this right: as we'll hear in more detail from  
 13 others, did the attackers have a phone in the van with  
 14 directions to Oxford Street showing on it?  
 15 A. Yes, they did.  
 16 Q. May we please have on screen {DC7736/1}. Try the next  
 17 page {DC7736/2}. So we can see there the screenshot of  
 18 the phone with directions to Oxford Street and  
 19 an estimated time?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Based on your inquiries, there's nothing to indicate  
 22 when the attackers first identified London Bridge and  
 23 Borough Market as the target of their attack?  
 24 A. Absolutely, sir, no evidence to suggest that that was  
 25 the intended location.

30

1 Q. So it's possible that the London Bridge/Borough Market  
 2 area was identified en route and that the first pass  
 3 over the bridge was the attackers' first reconnaissance  
 4 of the area?  
 5 A. Indeed, possible, yes, sir.  
 6 Q. We can take that off screen.  
 7 Finally, is this right: that we don't have CCTV of  
 8 all stages of the van's route?  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. So it's not clear when the attackers put on their mock  
 11 suicide belts and armed themselves?  
 12 A. That's true, sir, yes.  
 13 Q. May we now move to the CCTV compilation.  
 14 As with the other CCTV compilations we've viewed, is  
 15 this right: the Operation Datival team gathered a huge  
 16 amount of CCTV material in their inquiries and this has  
 17 been compiled into compilations to assist in giving  
 18 evidence at the Inquests?  
 19 A. That's correct, sir, yes.  
 20 Q. That a substantial compilation for pre-attack  
 21 preparations and movements was prepared.  
 22 A. That's correct.  
 23 Q. If we can begin with the first part of that, {AV0001}  
 24 and, as with other compilations, we will start each  
 25 clip, show what appears on screen, and then play after

1 it's been identified.  
 2 (Video played)  
 3 Clip 1. I think we'll see Redouane going to buy the  
 4 knives on 15 May, just before 10.00 pm, entering the  
 5 Lidl and getting a basket.  
 6 A. That's correct, sir.  
 7 Q. Play on, please.  
 8 (Video played)  
 9 Next, we'll see Redouane wheeling the basket down  
 10 the aisle with the knives visible in the basket?  
 11 A. That's correct, sir, unfortunately there was no CCTV of  
 12 him selecting knives and putting them in the basket.  
 13 Q. Play on, please.  
 14 (Video played)  
 15 The knives are vertical in the corner of the basket?  
 16 A. Yes, they are.  
 17 Q. We'll now see Redouane purchasing the items at the  
 18 self-service till.  
 19 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 20 (Video played)  
 21 Do we see he received some assistance from a member  
 22 of staff?  
 23 A. That's correct.  
 24 Q. Running the knives through.  
 25 A. That's correct.

1 Q. Then finally I think we'll see him completing the  
 2 purchase of the knives?  
 3 A. That's correct, sir.  
 4 Q. Play on, please.  
 5 (Video played)  
 6 A. We can just see him putting the knives into the bag now.  
 7 Q. Then next I think we're going to see footage from the  
 8 meeting of Butt, Redouane and Zaghba near the Ummah  
 9 Fitness Centre?  
 10 A. That's correct.  
 11 Q. The first clip I think will be a camera from Franzos

 10 (Video played)  
 11 Then finally we'll see him buy the wine just before

 2 the front of the restaurant?  
 3 A. That's correct.  
 4 Q. Play on, please.  
 5 (Video played)  
 6 Then I think we'll see in this next footage the  
 7 camera overlooking an entrance to the Ummah Fitness  
 8 Centre at 10.20 with a vehicle pulling up, Khuram Butt  
 9 getting out, the lights of the car flashing as Butt  
 10 walks into the gym?  
 11 A. That's correct, sir.  
 12 Q. Play on, please.  
 13 (Video played)  
 14 Then I think we'll see Butt leaving the gym at  
 15 23.24, so an hour later?  
 16 A. That's correct. I think the lights on the car flash.

 7 A. That's correct, I believe it was £170.  
 8 Q. We'll see Butt receive a brief call and make another  
 9 call on his mobile phone?

 11 Q. These are domestic scenes that couldn't be more  
 12 different from the night's events that were to follow?  
 13 A. Absolutely.  
 14 Q. The next set of clips I think are taken from just after

 16 showing Redouane leaving his address with some plastic  
 17 bags?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.

 21 We can see he is wearing the clothes he was to wear  
 22 in the attack?  
 23 A. That's correct.  
 24 Q. Then next we'll see him at the junction of Barking Road  
 25 and High Street North only carrying one of the bags,

1 a white bag, I think the view is that he discarded the  
 2 blue bag in a bin nearby?  
 3 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 4 Q. It is of course possible that he's discarding some of

 21 the correct times at each stage, the CCTV cameras are

 2 A. That's correct.

 21 Q. Yes, we can always identify him by the striped jumper?  
 22 A. That's correct.  
 23 Q. In this clip we're seeing him go towards the lifts.  
 24 A. Yes, sir.  
 25 Q. Now waiting for a lift.

43

1 A. Yes.  
 2 Q. Taking the lift up to Charisse O'Leary's level?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. Getting out of the lift?  
 5 A. Yes.  
 6 Q. And heading down the corridor towards Charisse O'Leary's  
 7 flat?  
 8 A. Yes, sir.  
 9 Q. Then I think now we're looking at footage from the  
 10 building's lobby 13 minutes later at 13.14, with  
 11 Charisse O'Leary leaving the building.  
 12 A. Yes, sir.  
 13 Q. Play on, please.  
 14 (Video played)  
 15 So we know that she has left Redouane and the child  
 16 in the apartment?  
 17 A. Correct, sir.  
 18 Q. The next clip, we're 49 minutes later at 14.03, a clip  
 19 showing Khuram Butt walking towards the building?  
 20 A. Yes, sir.  
 21 Q. Play on, please.  
 22 (Video played)  
 23 Then another clip with Khuram Butt walking towards  
 24 the entrance.  
 25 A. Yes, sir.

44

1 Q. A lobby camera showing Khuram Butt entering and going  
2 towards the lifts ?  
3 A. Yes, sir .  
4 Q. Continuing towards the lifts ?  
5 A. Yes, sir , as you can see, at this stage he's still  
6 wearing his tunic and his black top.  
7 Q. He appears to go back to the lobby and in this next clip  
8 he speaks to a person behind the counter before going  
9 back to the lifts ?  
10 A. Yes, sir .  
11 Q. He is returning to the lift .  
12 A. Correct.  
13 Q. Another clip showing him waiting for the lift .  
14 Now, at the same time can we see in a corridor on  
15 Charisse O'Leary's level , Redouane and the child are  
16 walking towards the lifts ?  
17 A. That's correct, sir .  
18 Q. Suggesting that they're expecting Khuram Butt?  
19 A. Yes, sir .  
20 Q. Play on, please.  
21 (Video played)  
22 Khuram Butt has entered the lift , he travels up: the  
23 doors open and the child enters .  
24 A. That's correct, sir .  
25 Q. Butt then goes out of the lift , and we'll see the same

45

1 sequence from the other perspective outside the lifts ?  
2 A. Yes, sir , that's correct.  
3 Q. Butt and the child leave the lift . Butt, Redouane and  
4 the child walk back towards Charisse O'Leary's flat ?  
5 A. That's correct, sir .  
6 Q. Then a clip from the corridor on Charisse O'Leary's  
7 level . As we saw, Redouane passed the child to Butt as  
8 they walked towards the flat ?  
9 A. Yes, sir .  
10 Q. Now we see, if we can pause there, the foyer camera  
11 corridor, now at 2.07 pm, 14.07, with Redouane, the  
12 child and Butt walking along the corridor away from the  
13 flat towards the lifts , suggesting they were only in or  
14 near the flat for a very short time?  
15 A. Yes, sir , a few minutes.  
16 Q. Play on, please.  
17 (Video played)  
18 We see them now waiting for the lift to go down?  
19 A. Yes.  
20 Q. Khuram Butt seeming to play with the child , then they go  
21 into the lift .  
22 A. Yes, sir .  
23 Q. Then on the ground floor we will see them leave the lift  
24 and move towards the exit .  
25 A. Yes, sir .

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1 Q. With Butt and Redouane in conversation. Then in the  
2 lobby we see them head towards the exit .  
3 A. Yes.  
4 Q. In this next clip , leaving the building .  
5 A. Yes.  
6 Q. We'll see they turn right?  
7 A. Yes, sir .  
8 Q. Now, on the road outside we see them walking west  
9 towards Northern Relief Road?  
10 A. We do.  
11 Q. Then further footage of them on the road outside the  
12 block still walking towards Northern Relief Road?  
13 A. Yes, sir .  
14 Q. It's now 14.10, 2.10?  
15 A. That's correct.  
16 Q. This next clip I think is at 15.30, 3.30 pm. Redouane  
17 carrying the child into the building and them heading  
18 towards the lifts .  
19 A. Yes.  
20 Q. But Butt no longer with them?  
21 A. That's correct, sir .  
22 Q. Play on, please.  
23 (Video played)  
24 A clip with Redouane and the child going towards the  
25 lifts . A clip with them entering the lift .

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1 A. That's correct.  
2 Q. A clip with them leaving the lift and heading towards  
3 Charisse O'Leary's flat ?  
4 A. Yes, sir .  
5 Q. A clip with them walking down the corridor towards the  
6 flat ?  
7 A. Yes, sir .  
8 Q. Then on this clip , one minute later at 15.33, I think  
9 we'll see Redouane returning towards the lift , still  
10 carrying a child , having spent only about a minute  
11 apparently in the flat ?  
12 A. That's correct, sir , a very short time.  
13 Q. Play on, please.  
14 (Video played)  
15 We see them in this clip going back towards the  
16 lift .  
17 A. Yes.  
18 Q. Entering the lift .  
19 A. Yes.  
20 Q. Then going down to reception again .  
21 A. Yes, sir .  
22 Q. Heading away from the lift towards the exit ?  
23 A. Yes, sir .  
24 Q. Moving through to the exit ?  
25 A. Yes.

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1 Q. We'll see them leave the apartment building and turn  
2 left?  
3 A. That's correct.  
4 Q. We then see an external view of Wakering Road  
5 immediately outside the building with Redouane's child  
6 seen as they're leaving the building?  
7 A. That's correct.  
8 Q. Play on, please.  
9 (Video played)  
10 Then, just pause there. So we saw the child just  
11 briefly in the bottom left corner of the shot, and then  
12 in this next view I think we're seeing the red Corsa  
13 car, which was registered to Butt but which Redouane  
14 sometimes used, coming out of shot into view around  
15 a bend in the road and towards the junction with Station  
16 Parade?  
17 A. That's correct, sir.  
18 Q. Play on, please.  
19 (Video played)  
20 Now we're now going to see a series of clips from  
21 outside Elizabeth Fry Apartments, Khuram Butt's block,  
22 from 15.45, 3.45 that afternoon. So this is 11 minutes  
23 after the last clip when we saw Redouane driving away  
24 from Charisse O'Leary's block, and in this clip, we'll  
25 see the Corsa, the red Corsa, parked at the entrance to

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1 Khuram Butt's block. We'll see Khuram Butt carrying  
2 a car seat, no longer now wearing the white tunic, and  
3 with his Arsenal shirt visible?  
4 A. Yes, sir, it's the first time we see him in the Arsenal  
5 shirt.  
6 Q. We'll see Redouane get out of a rear seat, carrying his  
7 child?  
8 A. That's correct.  
9 Q. We'll see Butt put a child seat in the car, apparently  
10 for the use of the child?  
11 A. Yes, sir.  
12 Q. And we'll see Redouane leaning into the car possibly to  
13 put the child in the seat?  
14 A. Yes, sir.  
15 Q. Play on, please.  
16 (Video played)  
17 There's Khuram Butt with the child seat?  
18 A. That's correct.  
19 Q. It looks like Redouane is putting the child in the car.  
20 A. That's correct, sir.  
21 Q. Then does this next clip follow on from the last one?  
22 Play on, please.  
23 (Video played)  
24 This is following on from the last clip with Butt  
25 fixing the seat in the car, and we'll see Redouane go

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1 round to the nearside and get in.  
2 A. That's correct.  
3 Q. We then see Butt get into the driver's seat, then get  
4 out and put his phone to his ear and Butt walking around  
5 using the phone?  
6 A. That's correct, sir.  
7 Q. And when we see Butt using the phone on this occasion,  
8 in a minute or so, that will correspond to the first  
9 calls making inquiries about hiring a car?  
10 A. That's correct.  
11 Q. Or a van, rather?  
12 A. The van.  
13 Q. So there's Butt on his mobile phone?  
14 A. Yes, sir.  
15 Q. This next clip effectively continues on in time from the  
16 last one, Butt shown from a different perspective coming  
17 into view while on his phone. We see him bringing his  
18 phone down from his ear and he spends time apparently  
19 using the phone and then puts it back to his ear, and  
20 I think this is consistent in time with further web  
21 searches and calls to hire companies?  
22 A. Yes, sir, as we mentioned previously.  
23 Q. Play on, please.  
24 (Video played)  
25 So there is he is towards the bottom right.

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1 This next clip I think is 15.58, six or seven  
2 minutes after the last clip, showing the outside of  
3 Elizabeth Fry Apartments and the parked red Corsa. In  
4 this clip I think we'll see Khuram Butt walk back to the  
5 Corsa, approach the offside windows, and pass or receive  
6 something through. We'll then see him look at his  
7 phone, put it to his ear and walk away from the car.  
8 We'll see him sit on a large stone until he ends the  
9 call and then remain there looking at something on the  
10 phone?  
11 A. That's correct, sir.  
12 Q. Play on, please.  
13 (Video played)  
14 Once again, the phone calls at this time are  
15 believed to be further phone calls to hire companies  
16 which you showed us in that long table?  
17 A. Yes, sir, they all correlate to the CCTV.  
18 THE CHIEF CORONER: Is the timing here, Mr Hough, is this  
19 the correct time?  
20 MR HOUGH: It is the correct time.  
21 THE CHIEF CORONER: I mean, I've got the chart of calls open  
22 in front of me, so one can see that the calls span the  
23 period 15.48 through and, in due course to Hertz, but  
24 they're all taking place in this period of time?  
25 MR HOUGH: Exactly. And there were also, we saw on the

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1 table, some web searches --  
 2 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes.  
 3 MR HOUGH: -- which are consistent with some of Butt's  
 4 movements.  
 5 The next clip is at 16.04, a couple of minutes after  
 6 the end of the last clip, a camera outside Elizabeth Fry  
 7 Apartments showing Butt walking towards the entrance,  
 8 standing next to a man in a red top who I think is  
 9 Habibur Murad, the neighbour?  
 10 A. That's correct, sir.  
 11 Q. And he appears to be hovering out his car?  
 12 A. Yes, sir.  
 13 Q. There's another man in a yellow top nearby, who is not  
 14 identified?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. Butt appears to be on the phone and Redouane can be seen  
 17 playing with his child?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. Play on, please.  
 20 (Video played)  
 21 The Corsa is just out of view to the right.  
 22 A. That's correct. I think you can just see a glimpse of  
 23 it on the right-hand side.  
 24 Q. Yes. Towards the bottom of the screen we can see  
 25 Redouane playing with the child.

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1 Then there we see Mr Murad in view, apparently  
 2 cleaning out his car.  
 3 A. Yes.  
 4 Q. And all the while, Butt is making calls which we believe  
 5 to be further calls to hire companies?  
 6 A. Yes.  
 7 Q. We can now go to the second part of the main  
 8 compilation, pre-attack 1B, {AV0002}, please. This  
 9 first clip will be another of the camera views outside  
 10 the apartment block, overlapping with the last clip.  
 11 Can we play on, please.  
 12 (Video played)  
 13 We can see Zaghba standing by the passenger door of  
 14 the Corsa, showing that by this time, all the three  
 15 attackers are together.  
 16 A. That's correct, sir.  
 17 Q. And Zaghba had been in the Corsa before.  
 18 A. Correct.  
 19 Q. Towards the end of this clip, we'll see Rachid Redouane  
 20 and his child come into view.  
 21 A. That's correct.  
 22 Q. Play on. This next clip ...  
 23 (Video played)  
 24 Sorry, I think that's still ...  
 25 This next clip, overlapping with the last clip,

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1 still at 16.04, play on, please, we'll see Butt walking  
 2 towards the entrance door and we'll see him speaking to  
 3 Habibur Murad.  
 4 (Video played)  
 5 A. That's correct.  
 6 Q. We'll see him making a very short call on his phone,  
 7 Murad still cleaning the car but talking to Butt.  
 8 A. That's correct, sir.  
 9 Q. Please start the next clip.  
 10 (Video played)  
 11 This is a view outside the apartment block again  
 12 from a longer distance. It's 4 to 5 minutes after the  
 13 end of the last clip, now 16.12, with Butt standing at  
 14 the rear of the car on his phone, Murad and the man in  
 15 yellow still present. We see a taxi pulls up and we'll  
 16 see Butt go and open the door for a female passenger?  
 17 A. That's correct.  
 18 Q. There he is opening the door to the apartment.  
 19 A. Yes, sir.  
 20 Q. Butt is continuing to look at his phone.  
 21 A. Yes, he is.  
 22 Q. Just to be clear, this is all before the transaction  
 23 with Murad, the transfer of money?  
 24 A. Yes, sir.  
 25 Q. So what we see is consistent with Habibur Murad's

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1 account that Butt initially spoke to him about hiring of  
 2 vans, Butt then made attempts to hire a van and then  
 3 later there was the financial transaction. We'll see  
 4 some evidence of that later on in the footage?  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. Play on.  
 7 (Video played)  
 8 This is, I think, a clip from a different camera  
 9 showing the same events, the same period of time from  
 10 a different perspective. What I propose to do, if  
 11 others are content, is move through this clip, as we've  
 12 seen the sequence of events, if you are content, sir?  
 13 THE CHIEF CORONER: Certainly.  
 14 MR HOUGH: Tape counter 14.22, please.  
 15 We're now seeing footage from 16.13, the middle part  
 16 of the last clip, which will show where Redouane is and  
 17 that he is now around the Corsa playing with the child?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. This is a continuation of an earlier clip, now 16.16.  
 20 (Video played)  
 21 Butt is walking with his phone and as he reaches the  
 22 end of the car, we will see him make a gesture to  
 23 Habibur Murad?  
 24 A. That's correct, sir.  
 25 Q. Just pause there. I think we'll see the same events in

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1 this clip from a different angle, and the gesture made  
 2 by Khuram Butt to Murad is a thumbs-up sign?  
 3 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 4 Q. Play on, please.  
 5 (Video played)  
 6 Pause here. I think we're now seeing footage  
 7 7 minutes after the last clip, now 16.25.  
 8 A. That's correct.  
 9 Q. Play on, please.  
 10 (Video played)  
 11 We see Murad wiping down the car and we'll see  
 12 Khuram Butt as he approaches hand something to Murad.  
 13 We see him stand by the car on the phone while Murad  
 14 opens the car door, reaches in and Habibur Murad is seen  
 15 to be on his phone.  
 16 A. That's correct.  
 17 Q. And this appears to be the time where Butt hands money  
 18 in return for the bank transfer, in accordance with  
 19 Habibur Murad's account?  
 20 A. That's correct, sir, all the times correlate.  
 21 Q. Murad reaching into the car?  
 22 A. Yes, sir.  
 23 Q. Then this next clip is showing events at the same time  
 24 as the last clip, we see Butt puts something on the back  
 25 of the car, I think his mobile phone?

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1 A. Yes, sir.  
 2 (Video played)  
 3 Q. In this clip he appears to have his wallet in his left  
 4 hand?  
 5 A. He does.  
 6 Q. He picks up his phone again.  
 7 A. Yes, he does.  
 8 Q. He's handling his phone and his wallet.  
 9 A. Yes, he is.  
 10 Q. Play on.  
 11 (Video played)  
 12 This next clip is 16.28, a couple of minutes after  
 13 the last clip, with Murad and Butt looking at their  
 14 phones, and then Habibur Murad puts his phone to his  
 15 ear?  
 16 A. I see, yes, he does.  
 17 Q. And it is believed that it's at this point in time that  
 18 Habibur Murad makes the bank transfer?  
 19 A. Yes.  
 20 Q. The bank records time that transfer to 16.31.  
 21 A. They do, sir.  
 22 Q. It's just a few minutes after that transfer that Butt  
 23 makes the online booking with Hertz?  
 24 A. That's correct, sir.  
 25 THE CHIEF CORONER: 16.34.

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1 MR HOUGH: 16.34.  
 2 The man Butt has just greeted is somebody I don't  
 3 think you've identified; is that right?  
 4 A. That's correct, sir.  
 5 Q. Then Butt goes out of view towards the red Corsa.  
 6 Pause here. I think this is now 6 minutes after the  
 7 end of the last clip, 16.39. If we play on, we'll see  
 8 Khuram Butt come out of the block carrying a brown  
 9 envelope and going towards the red Corsa.  
 10 (Video played)  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. Play on.  
 13 (Video played)  
 14 We'll see the same events from a slightly different  
 15 angle as Butt goes to get into the Corsa. We see in  
 16 this clip Butt get into the driver's seat?  
 17 A. That's correct.  
 18 Q. We'll see the car pulling away, turning right.  
 19 A. That's correct.  
 20 Q. It then, I think, comes to a halt for 2 minutes before  
 21 driving off. Nobody gets out during this period?  
 22 A. That's correct, sir.  
 23 Q. If we can skip forward, please, to 28.39 on the tape  
 24 counter, please. The next clip. We see the car moves  
 25 off and out of view at 16.41.

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1 A. That's correct.  
 2 Q. Pause here. We're now seeing the red Corsa at 16.42 on  
 3 King's Road near the North Street junction and we'll  
 4 pause it to see the occupants. It's possible to see  
 5 Butt driving, Zaghba in the front passenger seat, and  
 6 Redouane I think behind Zaghba?  
 7 A. That's correct, sir.  
 8 Q. Play on, please.  
 9 (Video played)  
 10 A. Which would fit as to where Butt put the child seat.  
 11 Q. Pause there. Go back a frame or two.  
 12 Pause. I think it's just about possible to see the  
 13 occupants.  
 14 A. Yes, sir.  
 15 Q. Your team have certainly identified them as there.  
 16 A. We have.  
 17 Q. Play on, please.  
 18 (Video played)  
 19 Pause here. We're now seeing cameras around B&Q in  
 20 Romford at 17.17 with the Corsa turning from the main  
 21 road into B&Q. Play on, please.  
 22 (Video played)  
 23 Play on. We'll see the Corsa drive, circled, in the  
 24 car park lane in the B&Q car park.  
 25 Pause here. We're now looking at footage from the

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1 B&Q car park and we can see Redouane in a striped top  
 2 and circled walking around the front of the Hertz van,  
 3 which is already in the car park.  
 4 A. That's correct.  
 5 Q. We'll see him walk around to the driver's side and then  
 6 to the passenger's side?  
 7 A. That's correct.  
 8 Q. Possibly checking it?  
 9 A. Yes, sir.  
 10 Q. Play on, please.  
 11 (Video played)  
 12 THE CHIEF CORONER: Again, the timing is correct, is it?  
 13 MR HOUGH: Yes. It's pretty much correct.  
 14 We're now going to see in a very brief clip  
 15 the camera sweeping, showing the van in view, and we'll  
 16 see that the red Corsa is just to the right of the van,  
 17 and parked just next to it?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. Play on, please.  
 20 (Video played)  
 21 There.  
 22 Pause there. We're now about to listen to the call  
 23 between Khuram Butt and Hertz. That would probably be  
 24 a convenient moment for the lunch break.  
 25 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes, we will break there, Mr Hough, and

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1 we will pick up on matters at 2 o'clock.  
 2 (12.58 pm)  
 3 (The Luncheon Adjournment)  
 4 (2.04 pm)  
 5 MR HOUGH: Good afternoon, Mr Jolley.  
 6 A. Good afternoon, Mr Hough.  
 7 Q. We're just about to hear parts of the phone call made by  
 8 Khuram Butt to Hertz, 17.39 on the day of the attack.  
 9 If we could play that, please.  
 10 (Audio played)  
 11 Could you move forward by two minutes, please, to,  
 12 I think, tape counter 3.40.  
 13 (Audio played)  
 14 Could we move forward by a little over 2 minutes to  
 15 37.10 on the tape counter, please.  
 16 (Audio played)  
 17 Now, that phone call was between 17.39 and 17.48.  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. I'm told that Khuram Butt entered the PIN at 17.50.  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Just to be clear, are you aware, did you discover from  
 22 your investigations, whether the PIN had been sent to  
 23 him originally, whether the call was a ruse to try to  
 24 obtain a free extension?  
 25 A. I don't think it was to try and obtain a free extension,

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1 sir.  
 2 Q. Thank you very much. We're now about to see a clip from  
 3 inside B&Q, 17.42, during the time of that call to  
 4 Hertz, and we'll see Rachid Redouane pushing a trolley  
 5 into the store. Play on, please.  
 6 (Video played)  
 7 Pause here. This is 13 minutes later at 17.55,  
 8 I think.  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. A B&Q camera at the front of the store, we'll see the  
 11 Hertz van move forward and turn left, driving slightly  
 12 out of view?  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. Play on, please.  
 15 (Video played)  
 16 Then this next shot, 17.58, if we can play on,  
 17 please, this is 2 or 3 minutes after the last clip,  
 18 Rachid Redouane now pulling a trolley containing bags of  
 19 gravel to the till?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. We'll see him wait, then take his mobile phone. We'll  
 22 see the mobile phone light up. We'll see him return it  
 23 to his pocket and then pay for the gravel at the till.  
 24 A. That's correct, sir.  
 25 Q. We can see he is paying cash?

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1 A. Yes, he is.  
 2 Q. Play on. In this next clip we'll see Rachid Redouane  
 3 circle, pulling the trolley away from the till to exit  
 4 the store?  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. In this next clip I think we're 5 minutes later at  
 7 18.06, looking out at the car park. The van is back in  
 8 place near where it was first parked. The driver's door  
 9 we can see is open. We can see a figure get out of the  
 10 van and walk to the rear and then we can see Khuram Butt  
 11 will be circled walking from the van towards the store  
 12 entrance?  
 13 A. That's correct, sir.  
 14 Q. Play on, please.  
 15 (Video played)  
 16 Play on. We'll see Khuram Butt entering the store  
 17 with a trolley.  
 18 A. Correct.  
 19 Q. In this clip -- pause there -- 2 minutes later, 18.09,  
 20 we see Khuram Butt with a trolley full of gravel.  
 21 A. That's correct, sir.  
 22 Q. Play on.  
 23 (Video played)  
 24 We can see from this clip Khuram Butt pull the  
 25 trolley towards the tills and then take the trolley out

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1 of view again.  
 2 A. That's correct.  
 3 Q. Pause here. I think this clip is at 18.16 showing the  
 4 car park of B&Q and we'll see Zaghba walking with  
 5 a trolley towards the store, returning the trolley and  
 6 then going back towards the van?  
 7 A. That's correct, sir.  
 8 Q. Play on, please.  
 9 (Video played)  
 10 So the footage thus far has therefore confirmed that  
 11 all the attackers are at B&Q together?  
 12 A. That's correct, sir and, like I said earlier, there are  
 13 29 bags in total of gravel.  
 14 Q. Play on.  
 15 (Video played)  
 16 We see now Khuram Butt at the tills paying for the  
 17 gravel, for the bags of gravel, again in cash, and then  
 18 heading out of the store?  
 19 A. Correct.  
 20 Q. A further clip near the exit as he's about to exit?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. Now we're looking at a clip 2 minutes later at 18.21  
 23 with Khuram Butt coming back into the store with  
 24 an empty trolley?  
 25 A. Correct.

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1 Q. You can see him within the store pulling a trolley  
 2 containing further gravel, but less than before.  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. Then a clip showing him moving through the till area  
 5 with the gravel, he passes the shop assistant but  
 6 doesn't pay; is this right, it's understood that he  
 7 prepaid for this additional gravel in the earlier  
 8 transaction?  
 9 A. Yes, that's as I understand, sir.  
 10 Q. And in this clip he's moving towards the exit with the  
 11 remaining gravel?  
 12 A. That's correct.  
 13 Q. Pause here. We're now looking at the clip of the car  
 14 park outside. The van has been circled. I think we'll  
 15 see the side door slide open and close and a figure walk  
 16 towards the rear, 18.26.  
 17 A. That's correct.  
 18 Q. Play on, please.  
 19 (Video played)  
 20 Pause there. This is 18.34, 7 minutes later.  
 21 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 22 Q. Will we see the van and the red Corsa together driven  
 23 out of the car park?  
 24 A. You will sir, yes.  
 25 Q. Play on, please.

1 (Video played)  
 2 There's the van departing. And the red Corsa.  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. Play on. In this final clip from near B&Q we see the  
 5 van followed by the Corsa leaving the store area.  
 6 A. Yes, sir.  
 7 Q. Pause here. I think we're now going to see a series of  
 8 pieces of footage showing Redouane going back to the  
 9 Barking & Dagenham Foyer, Charisse O'Leary's block, in  
 10 the red Corsa and returning the child?  
 11 A. That's correct, sir.  
 12 Q. So throughout the period at B&Q, the child had been with  
 13 the attackers?  
 14 A. That's correct.  
 15 Q. In this first clip we'll see the red Corsa approaching  
 16 the roundabout junction or in the roundabout junction  
 17 between Cecil Avenue and Longbridge Road taking the exit  
 18 for Northern Relief Road?  
 19 A. That's correct.  
 20 Q. Play on, please.  
 21 (Video played)  
 22 The Corsa is circled. Then pause. Do we see the  
 23 Corsa driven along the Northern Relief Road towards the  
 24 junction with Wakering Road?  
 25 A. Yes, you can.

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1 Q. Play on, still 19.07.  
 2 (Video played)  
 3 We will now see at 19.08 the red Corsa driven along  
 4 Wakering Road just outside Charisse O'Leary's building?  
 5 A. That's correct.  
 6 Q. Play on.  
 7 (Video played)  
 8 We can see in this next clip the Corsa parked and  
 9 we'll see Rachid Redouane get out of the driver's side  
 10 at one stage --  
 11 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 12 Q. -- during the parking manoeuvre?  
 13 Redouane has got out of the car.  
 14 We see Charisse O'Leary cross the road to the car?  
 15 A. Yes, you can.  
 16 Q. Then we see the child being taken out of the car. We  
 17 will see the two of them stand by the car for a short  
 18 while before walking back towards the building with  
 19 Redouane holding the child?  
 20 A. That's correct, sir.  
 21 Q. Just to be clear, this clip started at 19.08, which is  
 22 a little different from the time on the screen?  
 23 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 24 Q. As we see they're now walking together towards  
 25 Charisse O'Leary's apartment?

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1 A. They are, sir .  
 2 Q. Play on.  
 3 (Video played)  
 4 We now are looking at the foyer of  
 5 Charisse O'Leary's block and we'll see Redouane,  
 6 Charisse and the child entering the reception area with  
 7 Redouane still carrying the child as they head towards  
 8 the lifts ?  
 9 A. That's correct, sir .  
 10 Q. May we now go to {AV0003}, which is the continuation of  
 11 the compilation.  
 12 First of all we see on this camera Redouane,  
 13 Charisse and the child going towards the lifts ?  
 14 A. Yes, sir .  
 15 Q. And in the next clip we see them outside the lifts as  
 16 they wait, and we'll see Redouane giving something to  
 17 Charisse?  
 18 A. Yes, sir , probably the cash that was mentioned earlier.  
 19 Q. Yes, you mentioned that yesterday.  
 20 Then after that is handed over, we'll see that he  
 21 leaves while she and the child enter the lift ?  
 22 A. That's correct.  
 23 Q. Play on.  
 24 (Video played)  
 25 We're seeing Redouane moving away from the lifts and

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1 then going through the lobby to the exit?  
 2 A. Yes, sir , moving with a bit more purpose.  
 3 Q. Then an outside view, Redouane in this clip jogging  
 4 towards the Corsa?  
 5 A. That's correct.  
 6 Q. We see he reaches it and bends down before going back to  
 7 the Foyer building?  
 8 A. That's correct.  
 9 Q. In this next clip he reenters the Barking & Dagenham  
 10 Foyer building, he speaks to a person behind the  
 11 counter. He puts something down for him to sign.  
 12 A. That's correct.  
 13 Q. He then exits the building again.  
 14 A. That's correct, sir .  
 15 Q. In the next clip we see an exterior view with him going  
 16 to the Corsa and then we'll see him drive away along  
 17 Wakering Road.  
 18 A. That's correct, sir .  
 19 Q. We're now seeing CCTV covering Longbridge Road,  
 20 an approach to the Fishnets Roundabout, the Corsa which  
 21 is circled travels east towards Fishnets Roundabout. We  
 22 see it undertake a car and we can see, if we look  
 23 carefully , Redouane is driving .  
 24 A. Yes, sir .  
 25 Q. Then we see a different perspective, the Corsa

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1 approaching the roundabout junction at Cecil Avenue and  
 2 Longbridge Road and the car going round the roundabout  
 3 to Northern Relief Road?  
 4 A. That's correct.  
 5 Q. The time now, I think, 19.16 pm?  
 6 A. That's correct.  
 7 Q. Pause here. I think we're now going to look at some  
 8 clips showing the journey of the van towards the Shell  
 9 petrol station in Barking between 19.49 and 19.51 hours?  
 10 A. That's correct, sir .  
 11 Q. The van has come from Zaghba's flat .  
 12 A. Yes, sir , Fairfield Road.  
 13 Q. And Redouane has been picked up there.  
 14 A. Yes, sir , that's correct.  
 15 Q. After he drove the Corsa there.  
 16 A. That's correct.  
 17 Q. Play on, please. We're watching footage at the junction  
 18 of Tanner Street and Fanshawe Avenue. We see the van  
 19 come down Tanner Street and turn right into Fanshawe  
 20 Avenue.  
 21 (Video played)  
 22 A. That's correct.  
 23 Q. We see the van travelling through the roundabout  
 24 junction at Cecil Avenue and Longbridge Road going to  
 25 Northern Relief Road?

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1 A. That's correct.  
 2 Q. In this next clip we see the van travelling west on  
 3 Northern Relief Road.  
 4 A. Yes, sir .  
 5 Q. 19.51.  
 6 Pause here. We're now going to see some clips  
 7 between 19.53 hours and 20.04 hours showing the van  
 8 arriving at the Shell petrol station and the attackers  
 9 filling it with petrol and buying some drinks and snack  
 10 bars.  
 11 A. Yes, sir , that's correct.  
 12 Q. Play on, please.  
 13 (Video played)  
 14 First of all , we see the van driving south on the  
 15 Northern Relief Road and then driving onto the  
 16 forecourt.  
 17 A. Yes, sir .  
 18 Q. Pause here, please. Can we see that the van is just  
 19 pulling up next to the pumps at the Shell petrol station  
 20 and we can see from the reasonably clear footage that  
 21 Zaghba is driving with Redouane in his striped top in  
 22 the middle and Butt on the passenger side?  
 23 A. Yes, sir .  
 24 Q. Play on, please.  
 25 (Video played)

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1 We are now looking at footage from the same camera  
 2 2 minutes later. In this clip we'll see Zaghba and Butt  
 3 get out and Butt filling the van with diesel while  
 4 Zaghba goes to the shop?  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. This is 1 minute later with Butt continuing to fill the  
 7 van. We're now seeing a clip with Zaghba having gone  
 8 into the shop, he's at the counter putting drink and  
 9 food on the counter. We can see Zaghba handing over  
 10 some banknotes and then make a gesture suggesting he has  
 11 forgotten something before walking out of view?  
 12 A. That's correct, sir.  
 13 Q. That was the finger held up gesture.  
 14 A. Yes, sir.  
 15 Q. We see Zaghba leaving the shop in that clip. Then, just  
 16 pause here. I think this clip is overlapping with the  
 17 last clip. Butt having finished filling the van, he is  
 18 going to the shop entrance just as Zaghba is leaving.  
 19 A. That's correct, sir.  
 20 Q. Play on, please. We then see Zaghba going back into the  
 21 shop. In the next clip, him returning to the till.  
 22 A. Yes, sir.  
 23 Q. Meanwhile we see Butt returning to the van, opening the  
 24 passenger door and Redouane moves to the middle.  
 25 A. Yes, sir, he did.

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1 Q. Meanwhile, Zaghba approaches the till, places some cash  
 2 on the counter, and the goods are handed over.  
 3 A. Correct.  
 4 Q. We saw him there take his change and goods and head off.  
 5 A. Yes.  
 6 Q. In this next clip he is leaving the shop and we'll see  
 7 him getting back into the van into the driver's door,  
 8 with Redouane still in the middle and Butt on the  
 9 nearside. We then see the van driving off the  
 10 forecourt.  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. And then we see it driving from the petrol station  
 13 towards the Northern Relief Road going north now?  
 14 A. That's correct, sir, and as we discussed this morning,  
 15 takes that turning into Cowbridge Lane.  
 16 Q. Pause here. I think the next set of clips we have is  
 17 footage from outside Butt's apartment block between  
 18 20.25 and 20.52, and in the interim, between 20.04 and  
 19 20.25 there is that 10-minute stop at Cowbridge Road?  
 20 A. That's correct, sir.  
 21 Q. Play on, please. We're now looking at the scene outside  
 22 Butt's block as the van drives up King's Road and then  
 23 turns into Anne Mews which is a no entry road?  
 24 A. That's correct, sir.  
 25 Q. We see from a different view the van entering Anne Mews,

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1 and then we see Zaghba walking in Anne Mews towards the  
 2 entry to Khuram Butt's block.  
 3 Now, just to be clear with timings, those timings  
 4 all took place very quickly after the van arrived?  
 5 A. They did, sir, yes.  
 6 Q. And we're about to see another view with Khuram Butt  
 7 walking towards the apartment block?  
 8 A. That's correct.  
 9 Q. Play on, please.  
 10 (Video played)  
 11 We see he buzzes into the block, holds the door for  
 12 Redouane and Zaghba. We saw Redouane carrying a white  
 13 bag.  
 14 A. Yes, he was.  
 15 Q. We're seeing now the same events viewed from a different  
 16 angle. We can see that Zaghba is on his phone for part  
 17 of the time?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. This is 20.26.  
 20 A. Yes, sir.  
 21 Q. Pause here. We're now, I think, 20.42, so 16 minutes on  
 22 from the last clip. We're again looking at the entrance  
 23 to the apartment block and I think we'll see Butt and  
 24 Zaghba walk out of the block and turn toward Anne Mews.  
 25 We'll see Butt is now wearing the red hooded top that he

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1 was to wear in the attack. We'll see Butt carrying his  
 2 red suitcase, the red suitcase we saw in the back of the  
 3 van from after the attack?  
 4 A. That's correct, sir.  
 5 Q. And we'll see Zaghba carrying a stack of chairs, the  
 6 chairs that were later found in the back of the van?  
 7 A. That's correct, sir.  
 8 Q. And just to be clear, it would appear that the movement  
 9 of the chairs, which had been Mr Chigbo's, was part of  
 10 the cover story for the house move?  
 11 A. It would appear so, sir, yes.  
 12 Q. Play on, please.  
 13 (Video played)  
 14 The suitcase would appear to be heavy from the way  
 15 that Butt was holding it?  
 16 A. It would appear that way, sir, yes.  
 17 Q. We're now looking at the same sequence of events from  
 18 a different perspective, over Elizabeth Fry Apartments.  
 19 Then we see from a different camera, Butt and Zaghba  
 20 walking towards the van with those items.  
 21 A. Yes, we do.  
 22 Q. Then we see Zaghba return to the communal entrance.  
 23 We'll see Redouane in a moment inside through the glass  
 24 of the doors. We'll see him walk forward, put some  
 25 chairs down and let Zaghba in.

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1 A. That's correct, sir .  
 2 I believe it was four chairs in total .  
 3 Q. Thank you. We then see Zaghba and Redouane walk out of  
 4 view within the block.  
 5 A. Yes, we do.  
 6 Q. We then see Zaghba come back out of the block?  
 7 A. Yes, sir .  
 8 Q. And he was carrying something in a hand, perhaps some  
 9 keys or something?  
 10 A. Yes.  
 11 Q. We then see Redouane pick up the stack of chairs, walk  
 12 out of the block and towards where the van is parked on  
 13 Anne Mews?  
 14 A. That's correct .  
 15 Q. Now we're seeing the same sequence of events from  
 16 a different angle.  
 17 (Video played)  
 18 A. We are.  
 19 Q. Since we have seen this sequence we can skip forward,  
 20 please, to tape counter 20.00, and we'll just see the  
 21 end of that with Zaghba and Redouane moving towards  
 22 Anne Mews.  
 23 We see Zaghba walking down Anne Mews towards the  
 24 van.  
 25 A. Yes, sir .

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1 Q. Now we see the van coming into view, driven along King's  
 2 Road and turning left .  
 3 A. We do.  
 4 Q. I think now we see CCTV in King's Road, Barking, near  
 5 the junction with North Street. Pause there, please.  
 6 The view is east. I think this clip follows on from the  
 7 last one.  
 8 A. It does, yes.  
 9 Q. And did your officers establish that the images show  
 10 Butt in the middle, Redouane in the nearside seat, and  
 11 Zaghba driving?  
 12 A. Yes, sir, this is the same camera as the Corsa we saw  
 13 this morning.  
 14 Q. Now I think the time is 20.52?  
 15 A. That's correct, sir .  
 16 Q. And play on, please.  
 17 (Video played)  
 18 Pause here. I think we're now going to see a series  
 19 of clips showing the van as it travelled through the  
 20 City of London towards London Bridge?  
 21 A. That's correct, sir .  
 22 Q. You've told us that you were able to reconstruct the  
 23 route of the van from Elizabeth Fry Apartments to the  
 24 City, using GPS information, but you didn't have actual  
 25 footage between the Elizabeth Fry Apartments and the

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1 City at 21.32?  
 2 A. No, we didn't, sir . There was no footage recovered of  
 3 that journey.  
 4 Q. So you're not able to say, for example, whether the van  
 5 stopped for any periods of time on that journey with the  
 6 ignition on?  
 7 A. No, we're not, sir, no.  
 8 Q. In this first clip I think we'll see the van entering --  
 9 THE CHIEF CORONER: Sorry, can I just check that last  
 10 answer. That was about the ignition being off as  
 11 opposed to --  
 12 MR HOUGH: I think if the ignition is turned off --  
 13 THE CHIEF CORONER: There will be a record on the ...  
 14 MR HOUGH: -- there will be a record of that on the system.  
 15 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes, so if it's stopped with the  
 16 ignition on, there wouldn't be a record of that?  
 17 A. That's how I understood the question, sir, yes. If the  
 18 van stopped with the ignition on, we wouldn't be able to  
 19 tell whether it had stopped at that period of time.  
 20 THE CHIEF CORONER: Thank you.  
 21 A. Unless there was a long time delay in it moving off.  
 22 MR HOUGH: Yes.  
 23 We're now looking at footage from Aldgate High  
 24 Street, which should show the van entering the City .  
 25 A. That's correct .

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1 Q. Play on.  
 2 (Video played)  
 3 That's at 21.32. Then pause there. CCTV on  
 4 Fenchurch Street with the van continuing down Aldgate  
 5 High Street?  
 6 A. That's correct, sir .  
 7 Q. Play on, please.  
 8 (Video played)  
 9 Pause there. The van travelling west towards the  
 10 junction of Aldgate and Fenchurch Place?  
 11 A. That's correct .  
 12 Q. Play on. The van now travelling south in Fenchurch  
 13 Place, driving round a curve.  
 14 A. That's correct .  
 15 Q. In the next clip, the van travelling west in London  
 16 Street past the entrance to Fenchurch Street station .  
 17 A. That's correct .  
 18 Q. Then we see the van park where the south footway outside  
 19 70 Mark Lane.  
 20 A. That's correct .  
 21 Q. Pause there. I think the van waited outside  
 22 70 Mark Lane for 9 minutes?  
 23 A. That's correct .  
 24 Q. Between 21.35 and 21.44.  
 25 A. Yes, sir .

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1 Q. After that nine-minute wait, now at 21.44, the van moves  
 2 off again on London Street, initially with its hazard  
 3 lights on?  
 4 A. It does.  
 5 Q. And we'll see it stop for 30 seconds by the junction of  
 6 London Street and Mark Street?  
 7 A. That's correct.  
 8 Q. Play on, please.  
 9 (Video played)  
 10 We now see the van slowly turn left from London  
 11 [Street] into Mark Lane.  
 12 A. That's correct, sir.  
 13 Q. We now see it make a turn into Star Alley, which is not  
 14 an accessible road?  
 15 A. That's correct.  
 16 Q. Do we see the driver appears to have some difficulty  
 17 turning the van around?  
 18 A. He does, sir.  
 19 Q. And then after a few minutes I think the van is  
 20 manoeuvred and continues north along Mark Lane towards  
 21 the junction with Fenchurch Street?  
 22 A. That's correct.  
 23 Q. So this set of manoeuvres, at least, suggesting that the  
 24 driver is unfamiliar with his surroundings?  
 25 A. Yes, I would suggest at this point that the driver is

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1 lost.  
 2 Q. Also displaying every sign of someone who isn't familiar  
 3 with driving vans?  
 4 A. Yes, sir.  
 5 Q. Pause here. We're now at 21.47 and the van is going to  
 6 the junction of Fenchurch Street where it turns left.  
 7 A. That's correct, sir.  
 8 Q. Play on, please.  
 9 (Video played)  
 10 This next clip, the van going west in  
 11 Fenchurch Street towards the junction with Gracechurch  
 12 Street.  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. The next clip, the van turning left into Gracechurch  
 15 Street?  
 16 A. Yes, it does.  
 17 Q. Do you see it continues south towards the traffic lights  
 18 and then left into Eastcheap?  
 19 A. It does, yes. London Bridge being to the right-hand  
 20 side.  
 21 Q. Thank you. Do we see the van heading across the  
 22 junction with Fenchurch Street into Lime Street?  
 23 A. That's correct.  
 24 Q. Next, travelling into Fenchurch Avenue?  
 25 A. That's correct.

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1 Q. Then the next clip, back into Lime Street towards the  
 2 junction with Fenchurch Street?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. Pause here.  
 5 We're now looking at dashcam footage, is this right,  
 6 we are now at 21.54?  
 7 A. We are, sir, yes.  
 8 Q. We see the van going north-east in Fenchurch Street,  
 9 we'll see it turn into Leadenhall Street, ending up in  
 10 the wrong lane initially before correcting, and then  
 11 carrying on towards Gracechurch Street?  
 12 A. That's correct, sir.  
 13 Q. Play on, please.  
 14 (Video played)  
 15 So the van slightly overshoots its turn?  
 16 A. It does sir, yes. I believe that's an illegal turn.  
 17 Q. Pause here. We're now going to pick up the route of the  
 18 van on CCTV going down Leadenhall Street, then left into  
 19 Gracechurch Street.  
 20 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 21 Q. Play on.  
 22 (Video played)  
 23 We can see the Lloyd's building?  
 24 A. Yes, you can.  
 25 Q. In this clip we see closer up that left turn into

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1 Gracechurch Street?  
 2 A. Yes, sir.  
 3 Q. In this clip, the van travelling south on  
 4 Gracechurch Street towards London Bridge, retracing the  
 5 steps we saw earlier.  
 6 A. That's correct, on this occasion keeping to the  
 7 right-hand lane.  
 8 Q. And heading right into King William Street.  
 9 A. Yes, sir.  
 10 Q. And it's now heading towards London Bridge?  
 11 A. It is.  
 12 Q. Pause here. We can now see the van travelling from  
 13 Gracechurch Street to King William Street at the  
 14 junction with the north end of London Bridge?  
 15 A. That's correct, sir.  
 16 Q. Now at 21.57.  
 17 A. Correct.  
 18 Q. Play on, please.  
 19 (Video played)  
 20 Pause there. So in those various clips that we've  
 21 seen with the van going through the City, there are, as  
 22 you have told us, some signs of the van being lost,  
 23 retracing its steps, and no sign that the driver has  
 24 a very clear idea of the route?  
 25 A. That's correct, sir.

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1 Q. The driver has now reached the point of heading south  
 2 over London Bridge and we're going to see footage of the  
 3 first pass south over London Bridge between 21.58 and  
 4 22.02.  
 5 A. That's correct, sir.  
 6 Q. Play on, please.  
 7 (Video played)  
 8 We first of all see the van on dashcam footage,  
 9 bearing left into King William Street and then heading  
 10 south over London Bridge along Borough High Street, and  
 11 we see the full pass over London Bridge from this  
 12 dashcam footage as the driver follows the van over.  
 13 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 14 Q. In this first pass south over the bridge, there is no  
 15 unusual or illegal driving?  
 16 A. No, sir, none at all.  
 17 Q. The Barrow Boy & Banker now just ahead and on the right?  
 18 A. That's correct, sir.  
 19 Q. The van travels under the railway bridge by Lobos.  
 20 A. That's right, sir.  
 21 Q. Then we pick up its route -- we can pick up the route of  
 22 the van as it goes past the Post Office just opposite  
 23 Borough Kitchen.  
 24 A. That's correct, sir.  
 25 Q. Still heading south?

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1 A. Yes, sir.  
 2 Q. Then we see it go past the entrance of London Bridge  
 3 underground station, opposite Padella.  
 4 A. That's correct, sir.  
 5 Q. And then a bus camera showing the same movement.  
 6 A. Yes, sir.  
 7 Q. Now we see footage from the same bus pointing back as  
 8 the van continues south along Borough High Street.  
 9 A. It does.  
 10 Q. And a clip showing it going south further down Borough  
 11 High Street. The van passes the Royal College of  
 12 Occupational Therapists at a fair speed.  
 13 A. Yes, sir.  
 14 Q. Pause there. We're now at 22.02 and the van is at the  
 15 most southerly point it was detected on the footage; is  
 16 that right?  
 17 A. That's correct, sir.  
 18 Q. You weren't able to know for certain where the van  
 19 turned round; is that right?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. But given the timings, and where it is seen on the  
 22 footage, it's logical to think that it will have turned  
 23 around at the junction with Marshalsea Road?  
 24 A. Yes, sir, that's a perfectly good assumption to make.  
 25 Q. Play on, please.

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1 (Video played)  
 2 THE CHIEF CORONER: I think we see it the other side at  
 3 22.04, so the timings fit in.  
 4 MR HOUGH: I think perhaps we'll see it at 22.03 going the  
 5 other direction, sir.  
 6 So there it is coming in the opposite direction?  
 7 A. Yes, sir.  
 8 Q. Past the Royal College, continuing north on Borough High  
 9 Street. A route 21 bus now picking it up as it  
 10 continues north on Borough High Street.  
 11 A. That's correct.  
 12 Q. Another camera from the same bus, showing it continuing  
 13 north.  
 14 A. Yes, sir.  
 15 Q. It passes the office of McMillan Williams Solicitors  
 16 going north. Then in this next clip it passes  
 17 London Bridge underground station and Padella going  
 18 north.  
 19 A. Yes, sir.  
 20 Q. Passing Borough Kitchen and Lobos going north.  
 21 A. It does.  
 22 Q. Some footage from the Barrow Boy & Banker as the van  
 23 passes under the railway bridge and past the pub heading  
 24 north.  
 25 A. Yes, sir.

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1 Q. Then a route RV1 bus shows the van with the three  
 2 attackers. Just pause there. If we can just go back  
 3 a few clips so that we can just confirm their locations  
 4 in the van.  
 5 This is footage from a route RV1 bus, the offside  
 6 camera facing south, I think?  
 7 A. That's correct, sir.  
 8 Q. The van passes the bus and then moves off. We'll see  
 9 the -- we see the attackers in this shot, and I think  
 10 it's been identified that Zaghba was driving, Butt in  
 11 the middle and Redouane on the passenger side?  
 12 A. Yes, sir, by process of elimination, Zaghba was driving  
 13 due to the clothing of Butt and Redouane being clearly  
 14 identified.  
 15 Q. Their clothing is more identifiable because Zaghba's is  
 16 black?  
 17 A. That's correct, sir.  
 18 Q. And the time is now, I think, 22.05.  
 19 A. Yes, sir.  
 20 Q. Play on, please.  
 21 (Video played)  
 22 We then see the front camera from the same bus as  
 23 the van heads north across the bridge, now at 22.05.  
 24 We'll see at the end of the bridge, the van will make  
 25 a left turn at the junction with King William Street --

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1 sorry, it will move to the left at the junction with  
 2 King William Street and then make an unusually wide turn  
 3 to the right.  
 4 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 5 Q. Pause here. In the next and final clip I think we're  
 6 going to see the van completing a U-turn, first of all  
 7 overshooting the U-turn, reversing slightly, and then  
 8 completing a U-turn in order to head towards  
 9 London Bridge, going south.  
 10 A. Yes, sir.  
 11 Q. This clip I think will start at 22.06.18 and finish at  
 12 22.06.36.  
 13 A. That's correct.  
 14 Q. This clip will, I think, end with the van heading south  
 15 towards London Bridge, 15 seconds before it first mounts  
 16 the pavement.  
 17 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.  
 18 Q. Play on, please.  
 19 (Video played)  
 20 That, I think, is the end of the compilation.  
 21 Mr Jolley, thank you very much. Those are all the  
 22 questions I have for you now.  
 23 Sir, would that be a convenient time for the  
 24 mid-afternoon break?  
 25 THE CHIEF CORONER: We will take our mid-afternoon break

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1 there, thank you.  
 2 (3.17 pm)  
 3 (A short break)  
 4 (3.41 pm)  
 5 Questions by MR PATTERSON QC  
 6 MR PATTERSON: Mr Jolley, as you know, I ask questions on  
 7 behalf of the families of six of those who were killed  
 8 in the attack on 3 June 2017.  
 9 It's clear, isn't it, that by the time Khuram Butt  
 10 carried out that horrific attack he was a highly  
 11 radicalised violent jihadist?  
 12 A. Yes, sir, there has been evidence of his mindset.  
 13 Q. So even before we look at the background material that  
 14 you and your colleagues have assembled, the facts speak  
 15 for themselves, don't they, on 3 June in that he chose  
 16 to carry out this horrendous attack?  
 17 A. Yes, he made that choice.  
 18 Q. Targeting in an indiscriminate way, people that he had  
 19 never met before in the centre of London?  
 20 A. Yes, he did.  
 21 Q. From what you and your colleagues have assembled when  
 22 looking into his background, it's plain, isn't it, that  
 23 the warning signs began to appear in and around 2012 and  
 24 2013?  
 25 A. I think it's fair to say, sir, that a lot of the people

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1 that we spoke to were post-incident, so a lot of that  
 2 information was only obtained after --  
 3 Q. After the attack.  
 4 A. Yes, sir.  
 5 Q. Absolutely, and please let me make it plain that at this  
 6 stage what I'm focusing on with your help is  
 7 understanding what we now know about Khuram Butt from  
 8 the post-attack investigation?  
 9 A. Okay, sir.  
 10 Q. But would you agree with that that really the  
 11 radicalisation appears to have begun in and around 2012  
 12 and 2013?  
 13 A. Yes, sir, there's evidence of that.  
 14 Q. And there were some features of his behaviour that  
 15 clearly were significant and features that perhaps you  
 16 as an investigator will have seen in other cases, such  
 17 as turning away from former friends or former  
 18 activities; yes?  
 19 A. Yes, he did do that.  
 20 Q. Distancing himself from certain members of his family  
 21 who would see less of him than in the past?  
 22 A. Yes, we've ascertained that.  
 23 Q. Beginning to talk about wanting to live overseas and  
 24 practising in a Muslim country?  
 25 A. Yes, there's evidence of that.

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1 Q. And expressions of the passion that he had for his newly  
 2 acquired beliefs?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. His sister, Haleema Butt, got married in October 2012;  
 5 is that right?  
 6 A. She did.  
 7 Q. And then he, Butt, got married in December 2013, so  
 8 a little over a year later?  
 9 A. That's correct.  
 10 Q. And one of the individuals that you and your colleagues  
 11 traced and spoke to was a friend of Butt's called  
 12 Hamza Raza; is that correct?  
 13 A. Yes, he was spoken to.  
 14 Q. And did he provide quite a lot of information about the  
 15 radicalisation of Khuram Butt?  
 16 A. Yes, he did, he provided a detailed statement.  
 17 Q. And it's a 15-page statement that he provided in October  
 18 of 2017, a formal statement to the police with  
 19 a declaration of truthfulness in the way that police  
 20 statements are normally compiled; yes?  
 21 A. He did.  
 22 Q. And did he tell you and your investigators that in terms  
 23 of influential people when focusing on the  
 24 radicalisation of Butt, that one of the influential  
 25 people in Butt's changing attitudes was Zahrah's

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1 brother, so the brother of his wife, a man called  
 2 Hashim?  
 3 A. Yes. He said Hashim Rehman had influenced his beliefs  
 4 around Islam.  
 5 Q. And he said that the changes, and if we need to go to  
 6 the statement we can go to it and do say if you want and  
 7 I can have it put up on the screen, but he said that for  
 8 about a year before the marriage, which was towards the  
 9 end of 2013, Khuram Butt had begun to change; yes?  
 10 A. Sorry, can you repeat that? A year before the ...?  
 11 Q. Yes, he said when Khuram changed it was one year before  
 12 he got married?  
 13 THE CHIEF CORONER: We know that was December 2013.  
 14 MR PATTERSON: So the marriage was in December 2013 --  
 15 A. 25 December 2013.  
 16 MR PATTERSON: -- so we are looking at the end of 2012  
 17 through to the end of 2013; that was the period that he  
 18 was focusing on; that's right, isn't it?  
 19 A. That's what Hamza Raza says, yes.  
 20 Q. And he told you, didn't he, that the person who  
 21 influenced him was his brother-in-law, Hashim?  
 22 A. Yes, he did.  
 23 Q. And did he say that this individual bombarded him with  
 24 knowledge?  
 25 A. Yes, he did.

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1 Q. And that Khuram Butt's knowledge was getting stronger  
 2 and stronger and his knowledge was getting stronger even  
 3 than his brother-in-law's knowledge?  
 4 A. I can't remember the full detail of the statement, sir,  
 5 but I take it that you have it in front of you, so if  
 6 that's what he said, then yes.  
 7 Q. And did he say that it was like somebody was pulling the  
 8 strings, and that person was his brother-in-law?  
 9 A. Like I say, sir, I haven't got the statement in front of  
 10 me, but if that's what he said, then I have read it but  
 11 I can't remember the full detail of the statement.  
 12 Q. In that case, let's have it on the screen. It's  
 13 {WS1225/6}, please. A little below the halfway point he  
 14 wrote:  
 15 "When Khuram changed, it was one year before he got  
 16 married."  
 17 A. Yes, I can see that.  
 18 Q. The person who influenced him was his brother-in-law?  
 19 A. Yes.  
 20 Q. And we see that he spoke about how he had bombarded  
 21 Khuram with knowledge?  
 22 A. Yes, I can see that.  
 23 Q. And he went on how:  
 24 "Khuram's attitude to the West, to the Americans and  
 25 the British started changing."

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1 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 2 Q. He described how his behaviour changed, he was not  
 3 drinking or smoking in the way that he had previously?  
 4 A. Yes, I can see that.  
 5 Q. And then he said this:  
 6 "... you could tell he was openly hating and he  
 7 wanted to hate ... when I knew that he was hating and he  
 8 had that inside him, that anger, it was like someone was  
 9 pulling his strings kind of thing, and that person was  
 10 his brother-in-law."  
 11 A. Yes, Hamza Raza does say that.  
 12 Q. And that's what he was telling your investigators,  
 13 wasn't it?  
 14 A. Yes, that's what he told us, like I say, post-attack.  
 15 Q. And on a number of occasions in the statement he spoke  
 16 about how, in his view, Butt became brainwashed, that  
 17 was the word that he used, wasn't it?  
 18 A. I believe he does use that word, yes, sir.  
 19 Q. And he spoke about how Butt believed that there was  
 20 a holy war in which the West were engaged?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. And at {WS1225/7}, he spoke about how Butt would say  
 23 you're not supposed to follow the rules in the country  
 24 that you're in?  
 25 A. Yes.

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1 Q. So, in other words, living as he was in London, in the  
 2 United Kingdom, his view was that he was not obliged to  
 3 abide by the laws of the land?  
 4 A. Yes, that was his view.  
 5 Q. And that's something that we see in other statements  
 6 from other individuals who assisted you with your  
 7 inquiries?  
 8 A. That's correct.  
 9 Q. That attitude --  
 10 A. Yes.  
 11 Q. -- that he owed his obligations not to Britain, not to  
 12 our laws that we're all obliged to follow, but  
 13 a different set of rules?  
 14 A. Yes, I think it's fair to say that that was apparent  
 15 from a lot of the people that we spoke to.  
 16 Q. And he also said, and this is the second person I want  
 17 to ask you about, that he met on more than one occasion  
 18 with Anjem Choudary.  
 19 A. Yes, he did, sir.  
 20 Q. And that those meetings had even begun before the  
 21 marriage, which was in December 2013?  
 22 A. Yes, I believe that's the case.  
 23 Q. At the bottom of page 7, three lines up from the bottom:  
 24 "The relationship [that he] had with Anjem Choudary  
 25 began before he got married."

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1 So prior to December 2013?  
 2 A. Yes, sir.  
 3 THE CHIEF CORONER: 2015. I think you said 2017, but you  
 4 meant 2015?  
 5 MR PATTERSON: 2013.  
 6 THE CHIEF CORONER: 2013.  
 7 A. 2013. The marriage was 25 December, 2013.  
 8 MR PATTERSON: That's right. And he said, didn't he, that  
 9 Butt would refer to non-believers as "kuffars".  
 10 A. Yes, he did.  
 11 Q. He said that Butt had said:  
 12 "Don't worry about them, we've got them, they should  
 13 be scared of us".  
 14 So in other words, kuffars, non-believers, should  
 15 fear him or be scared of Butt?  
 16 A. Yes, sir.  
 17 Q. And, as you told us yesterday, Butt was described as  
 18 being somebody who, when around Anjem Choudary, was  
 19 acting in a way that appeared to be energised?  
 20 A. Yes.  
 21 Q. Like a lion out of a cage?  
 22 A. Yes, it was from his statement that we obtained that  
 23 information.  
 24 Q. So it's plain, isn't it, from what you were being told  
 25 by a friend, someone who actually knew him at the time,

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1 that Butt was somebody in respect of whom Choudary had  
 2 a very real influence?  
 3 A. Yes, sir, I think that's fair to say.  
 4 Q. And those references that we see there to him expressing  
 5 open hatred, is it the case that there was only one  
 6 occasion that anyone reported him to the police or the  
 7 authorities prior to the attack in June 2017?  
 8 A. Sorry, sir, can you repeat that question?  
 9 Q. Well, you told us yesterday that Usman Darr reported him  
 10 on the terrorist hotline?  
 11 A. That's correct, sir, on 30 September 2015.  
 12 Q. Is that the only time anyone reported him, either family  
 13 or friends or anyone else?  
 14 A. That's the only record that we have of anyone reporting  
 15 him to us.  
 16 Q. So if that's right, what we've been told by his friend,  
 17 that he was openly expressing these radical and  
 18 extremist views, open hatred for -- openly expressing  
 19 hatred for this country, a lot of family and friends  
 20 weren't reporting that to anyone, were they?  
 21 A. Like I say, sir, the only record we have is of the  
 22 Anti-Terrorist Hotline call on 1 September 2015.  
 23 Q. He described Butt's views as being "completely off the  
 24 scale"; that's right, isn't it?  
 25 A. Yes, that's his words.

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1 Q. And he spoke about how he was being influenced by Sheikh  
 2 Faisal, a notorious propagandist and convicted  
 3 terrorist?  
 4 A. Yes, sir.  
 5 Q. Convicted at this court in 2003 for soliciting the  
 6 murder of Jews and Hindus?  
 7 A. I'm not totally familiar with the case, sir, but  
 8 I believe so.  
 9 Q. It's dealt with in your report at a footnote at page 16?  
 10 A. Correct.  
 11 Q. And he was able to listen to this sort of propaganda on  
 12 the internet, so speeches and radicalising propaganda  
 13 from this convicted Sheikh Faisal?  
 14 A. Yes, I believe so.  
 15 Q. Another witness told your officers that he regarded all  
 16 Shia Muslims as being non-believers?  
 17 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 18 Q. And he became more rigid, more hard-hearted, and began  
 19 to follow a much more hardline version of Islam?  
 20 A. Yes.  
 21 Q. He said that he would go to Choudary's house: where was  
 22 that?  
 23 A. I'm not entirely sure, sir. I believe it's in Ilford.  
 24 Q. So not very far away from the area that we've been  
 25 looking at, in Barking and East Ham and so forth. So

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1 all in this part of east London?  
 2 A. I believe so, sir, yes.  
 3 Q. He said that he met with Choudary there and had dinner  
 4 with him?  
 5 A. Yes.  
 6 Q. He deals with this in his statement at page 13. I think  
 7 he's describing at least two occasions when he was there  
 8 with Butt having dinner with Choudary at Choudary's home  
 9 address; is that right?  
 10 A. Yes, he does.  
 11 Q. And he said that:  
 12 "This was a few years ago, not last year, maybe the  
 13 year before."  
 14 So the statement was given in 2017, so it looks as  
 15 though he was describing these visits to Choudary's home  
 16 address as taking place in 2015?  
 17 A. Yes, if these dates are correct.  
 18 Q. If his dates are correct?  
 19 A. That's correct.  
 20 Q. Haleema Butt, the sister of Butt, wrote in her statement  
 21 that he -- that her brother idolised Anjem Choudary; is  
 22 that right?  
 23 A. Again, sir, that's what she told us, yes.  
 24 Q. And his brother, Saad Butt, from whom I think we'll be  
 25 hearing, said that when he visited with Choudary, he met

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1 not only Anjem Choudary but also Abu Baraa, another  
 2 convicted terrorist, called Mizanur Rahman?  
 3 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 4 Q. Someone who was convicted many years earlier in relation  
 5 to Danish cartoon protests in relation to the Prophet  
 6 Mohammed?  
 7 A. Correct.  
 8 Q. And who was ultimately tried and convicted alongside  
 9 Choudary at this court in 2016?  
 10 A. He was.  
 11 Q. In terms of the dates, Choudary's arrest was  
 12 in September 2014; is that correct?  
 13 A. I believe that's correct, sir, yes.  
 14 Q. He was arrested alongside a large number of other  
 15 individuals, all arrested on suspicion of terror  
 16 offences?  
 17 A. Yes, they were.  
 18 Q. And we'll go into the details of those individuals in  
 19 due course, but some of them featured in the Jihadis  
 20 Next Door documentary?  
 21 A. I believe some of them did, yes.  
 22 Q. So he was arrested on suspicion of terror offences, he  
 23 was released on bail, and he was charged about a year  
 24 later on 5 August 2015?  
 25 A. Yes, sir, I don't know the exact dates, but I believe

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1 that's the timescales, about right, yes.  
 2 Q. And then the trial and conviction and sentencing was in  
 3 the summer of 2016?  
 4 A. That's correct.  
 5 Q. So 2014, 2015, 2016, those are the key dates. So it  
 6 looks, doesn't it, as though Butt was visiting the home  
 7 address of Choudary at a time when he was somebody who  
 8 had been released on bail under suspicion of terrorist  
 9 offences?  
 10 A. Yes, sir, that would have been correct.  
 11 Q. You also in your investigations found suggestions that  
 12 Choudary had been to Butt's home address?  
 13 A. Yes.  
 14 Q. So that flat we've all been looking at at Elizabeth Fry  
 15 Apartments. So on at least three occasions, the two men  
 16 were together in each other's houses?  
 17 A. I can't remember exactly how many occasions but yes,  
 18 there are a couple of occasions definitely.  
 19 Q. And Hamza Raza told you and your officers some of the  
 20 things that Choudary had been speaking to him about, and  
 21 Butt would make a quotation or would say something and  
 22 then Raza would ask him about this and he would say:  
 23 well, this is what Anjem told me.  
 24 THE CHIEF CORONER: So just so we've got this exact, when  
 25 the statement is on the screen, Mr Patterson, one can

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1 see that very often it's in the first person saying  
 2 "I did this, I did that", then sometimes one sees that  
 3 it's "He told me this, he told me that".  
 4 MR PATTERSON: Let's get it on the screen so that we can ...  
 5 THE CHIEF CORONER: So just in fairness to the officer it is  
 6 quite confusing when one reads the statement to see  
 7 whether in fact it is the witness statement maker who is  
 8 actually saying what he was told by somebody else --  
 9 MR PATTERSON: Absolutely.  
 10 THE CHIEF CORONER: -- as opposed to what he heard himself.  
 11 MR PATTERSON: Absolutely. If we can have that statement  
 12 back on the screen, please, and it's page 14  
 13 {WS1225/14}. If you look, officer, about a third of the  
 14 way down, he writes:  
 15 "... afterwards, I would find out from Khuram, I was  
 16 asking him, 'Where did you get this quote from?'"  
 17 Do you see that? It's about ten lines down.  
 18 A. Yes.  
 19 Q. "... and he would say [so Butt would say] 'Anjem  
 20 Choudary told me. He does his research, he knows,  
 21 bruv '... he's our preacher.'"  
 22 THE CHIEF CORONER: Just, Mr Patterson, the point that I was  
 23 trying to make, if one goes to the first main paragraph  
 24 on that page we get the maker of this statement saying  
 25 "When I went to Anjem Choudary, he welcomed me", and so

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1 it goes on, and doesn't actually say anything to the  
 2 maker but he's relating what it is that Butt appears to  
 3 be saying to him from that conversation.  
 4 MR PATTERSON: That's right. Do you agree, officer, that  
 5 that's what appears to have been relayed to your  
 6 officers by this witness, that Butt would say something  
 7 and it would emerge that it was coming originally from  
 8 Choudary?  
 9 A. Yes, sir, that's how it reads.  
 10 Q. It's been swallowed by Butt, he regurgitates it,  
 11 swallows it hook, line and sinker, and was clearly  
 12 radicalised by this man Choudary?  
 13 A. Yes, sir, that's how it is.  
 14 Q. And he regards him as their leader, their preacher?  
 15 A. Yes, that's in his statement.  
 16 Q. That's what his friend was telling you, isn't it?  
 17 A. Yes.  
 18 Q. And for many years, the police and the authorities have  
 19 known of the links between this organisation,  
 20 Al-Muhajiroun, and many convicted terrorists?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. And Choudary was regarded as, if not the leader,  
 23 certainly a very significant leading figure at the top  
 24 of that organisation; yes?  
 25 A. He clearly had links, sir, yes.

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1 Q. And it was a proscribed terrorist organisation: the  
2 government outlawed it or banned it, didn't they?  
3 A. Yes, it is a proscribed organisation, sir.  
4 Q. And as the names change, the government had to ban the  
5 different organisation with the new name, and we have  
6 a statutory instrument which we can go to where it shows  
7 that different names were added to the prohibition over  
8 the years, trying to capture the same network?  
9 A. That's correct, sir.  
10 Q. If we could see on the screen, please {DC8241/1}. This  
11 is a document, I'll take this quickly, his Lordship will  
12 perhaps remember this, but if we go to {DC8241/8}.  
13 THE CHIEF CORONER: I do remember it, because we had it  
14 fairly extensively during the course of  
15 Westminster Inquests.  
16 Q. In relation to Masood, that's right. And officer,  
17 I think you have been provided with a copy of this, but  
18 David Anderson QC, now Lord Anderson, the independent  
19 reviewer of legislation in a foreword commended this  
20 document which pulled together a lot of research as to  
21 convicted terrorist offenders, and if we just go,  
22 please, to the table, if you go to {DC8241/93}, the  
23 short point is that for many, many years, terrorist  
24 offenders convicted in this country have had links to  
25 Al-Muhajiroun. If we could expand, please, the left of

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1 the page. Going back to 1998 and 2001 and the years  
2 that follow, the analysis shows that although often  
3 there are links to Al-Qaeda or other terrorist  
4 organisations, again and again, Al-Muhajiroun has links  
5 to these convicted terrorists, isn't that right?  
6 A. It's detailed in the report, sir, yes.  
7 Q. And as a counter-terrorism investigator, they will no  
8 doubt be names and plots that you are sadly familiar  
9 with: the ricin bomb cell and Kamel Bourgass; the  
10 fertiliser bomb cell and Omar Khyam; the 7/7 bombings  
11 and Mohammad Sidique Khan; Mizanur Rahman, Abu Baraa who  
12 I have mentioned already, who was visited and who Butt  
13 met with at the home address of Choudary in 2016,  
14 convicted in relation to protests concerned with the  
15 Danish cartoons; over on to the next page, please  
16 {DC8241/94} and again if we could rotate and expand the  
17 left of the page, the liquid bomb plot; protests at the  
18 Regent's Park mosque, Omar Brooks; further down the  
19 page, travellers for overseas training, a large body of  
20 convicted offenders in 2010; the Stock Exchange bomb  
21 cell plot; do you see that, officer?  
22 A. Yes, I can see them, sir.  
23 Q. And on to {DC8241/95}, and more recent years, again and  
24 again and again that first column has ticks indicating  
25 that ALM, and so Choudary's organisation, was linked to

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1 these convicted terrorists. That's right, isn't it?  
2 A. Yes, it's detailed in that report.  
3 Q. As we go down the page, if we bear in mind that Butt's  
4 association with Choudary began prior to  
5 his December 2013 marriage, so 2012, 2013, in and around  
6 that period, we can see the very large number of ALM  
7 convicted terrorists: the Muslim Patrol attackers; the  
8 attack on Lee Rigby which was in May 2013, Adebolajo and  
9 Adbowale, links to ALM; would you agree?  
10 A. It's detailed in the report, sir, yes.  
11 Q. And finally on {DC8241/96}, and this obviously ends two  
12 years before our attack that we're dealing with, which  
13 was in 2017, but right up to 2014 and 2015 the pattern  
14 continues, doesn't it?  
15 A. Yes, sir.  
16 Q. Names that many of us who work in these courts are  
17 familiar with, Ziamani, the attack planner, the  
18 beheading plot, in 2014, for example?  
19 A. Yes, sir.  
20 Q. And particularly in recent years, not only have police  
21 and authorities been aware of ALM's role and Choudary's  
22 role, but the press have been reporting his role,  
23 haven't they?  
24 A. They have.  
25 Q. And the public have had many reports, haven't they,

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1 notifying them of ALM and Choudary and the group linked  
2 to Choudary.  
3 A. Yes, there's a lot of information that comes in in  
4 relation to ALM.  
5 Q. One of the features of your investigation is that  
6 witnesses again and again describe how Butt would argue  
7 that you should not participate in the democratic  
8 process in this country?  
9 A. Yes, as I've already agreed, lots of witnesses have  
10 provided that information.  
11 Q. And specifically not to vote in a general election?  
12 A. Yes.  
13 Q. And so one of the people that you interviewed,  
14 Shahid Iqbal, said that Butt would say things like "This  
15 country is not for Muslim people", and when Shahid Iqbal  
16 spoke to him and said "But we leave here, we are part of  
17 society", Butt would reply "No, no, no, you can't be  
18 talking like that", in other words taking the view that  
19 you shouldn't participate in these features of British  
20 life?  
21 A. Again, that's the information that Shahid Iqbal provided  
22 to us, yes.  
23 Q. And another person that you spoke to, Ahmed Syed, said  
24 how he interrupted an imam preaching at the mosque at  
25 the time of the 2015 general election and called him

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1 a liar for trying to encourage people to participate in  
 2 the elections. So it's the same theme, isn't it?  
 3 A. Yes, sir.  
 4 Q. And he got banned and the witness described how Butt was  
 5 quite angry about this episode and quite angry when he  
 6 intervened in this way at the mosque?  
 7 A. Yes, again that's the information we have provided with.  
 8 Q. Habibur Murad, when he was interviewed said that he was  
 9 aware of Butt being kicked out of a mosque for arguing  
 10 that people shouldn't vote; is that correct?  
 11 A. Yes.  
 12 Q. And he said that those who kicked him out -- remember  
 13 the words of the individuals at the mosque, the imam or  
 14 whoever, they were saying "If you don't want to live  
 15 here, why are you here?" in other words, go elsewhere,  
 16 if you want to live overseas, for example?  
 17 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 18 Q. And again that's something we see on more than one  
 19 occasion when we go through the evidence that you and  
 20 your colleagues assembled. People were telling him "If  
 21 you don't like this country, you're free to live  
 22 elsewhere?"  
 23 A. Yes, sir. His family members said something similar.  
 24 Q. But he chose to stay?  
 25 A. He did.

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1 Q. If we can go back, please, to Mr Raza's statement, so  
 2 {WS1225/11}, he told you this, Butt spoke about wanting  
 3 to live under sharia law and he said this western world,  
 4 this kuffar world, is not the world; that's right, isn't  
 5 it?  
 6 A. Yes, sir.  
 7 Q. And he said this:  
 8 "A line he was famous for ..."  
 9 So in other words, a line that Butt would say, or  
 10 something would say, is this:  
 11 "Anjem Choudary is right, we should get our free  
 12 money that the Government give, that's our money to  
 13 attack the West, to attack the British, to attack the  
 14 Americans, we should use their money to attack  
 15 themselves!"  
 16 A. Yes.  
 17 Q. And he goes on:  
 18 "That's what he used to think about because Anjem  
 19 Choudary used to tell him this and he would come back  
 20 and tell us this."  
 21 That's what he told you, isn't it?  
 22 A. That's what Hamza Raza said, yes.  
 23 Q. And you told us yesterday that there were times when  
 24 Butt was on state benefits, I think you said right up  
 25 until the attack he had regular receipts coming into his

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1 bank account of taxpayers' money?  
 2 A. Yes, he was on Jobseekers Allowance, yes.  
 3 Q. And you told us also that he chose to take a job,  
 4 employed by Transport for London, but chose to go sick  
 5 for many, many months doing actually very little work,  
 6 but throughout that whole period he was receiving full  
 7 pay; is that correct?  
 8 A. Yes, he was.  
 9 Q. And I think you indicated that there was a suggestion  
 10 that this had been something that he had been advised to  
 11 do by somebody who was linked to his wife Zahrah; is  
 12 that right?  
 13 A. Yes, sir, I believe that's correct.  
 14 Q. So a very cynical attitude of taking as much as you can  
 15 from this country financially?  
 16 A. It would appear that way, yes.  
 17 Q. And this material that you were told by Hamza Raza about  
 18 what Choudary was saying, what the witness was saying  
 19 was Choudary was encouraging him to use money from the  
 20 government to attack the British?  
 21 A. Yes, again, sir, that's what Mr Raza says.  
 22 Q. What does Anjem Choudary say about this?  
 23 A. I don't know, sir.  
 24 Q. Well, this appears to be material suggesting that Anjem  
 25 Choudary encouraged Khuram Butt to commit a terrorist

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1 attack; would you agree?  
 2 A. That's what that says, sir, but I don't know what Anjem  
 3 Choudary said exactly to Khuram Butt.  
 4 Q. But have you interviewed him or investigated it further?  
 5 A. In relation -- during this inquiry? No, sir.  
 6 Q. It is a criminal offence to encourage another person to  
 7 commit a terrorist attack, isn't it?  
 8 A. Yes, it is.  
 9 Q. And would you agree that it does look as though that's  
 10 what the evidence suggests; that this was somebody  
 11 reporting to you that Choudary encouraged Butt to commit  
 12 a terrorist attack?  
 13 A. No, I don't think that reads like that, sir, and that's  
 14 hearsay as well, obviously.  
 15 THE CHIEF CORONER: Well, I think it's Mr Hamza reporting  
 16 what he has been told by Mr Butt as to what Mr Butt is  
 17 saying he has been told by Choudary.  
 18 MR PATTERSON: Yes.  
 19 THE CHIEF CORONER: That's how that part of that statement  
 20 reads.  
 21 MR PATTERSON: Absolutely. But the suspicion that this  
 22 creates, clearly, is that Choudary was encouraging him  
 23 to attack, wouldn't you agree?  
 24 A. There is clearly encouragement in this statement but,  
 25 like I say, sir, there isn't -- that's hearsay evidence

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1 and we would look to -- seek an evidential case before  
 2 we put it to the Crown Prosecution Service.  
 3 Q. Yes, but cases are often investigated on the basis of  
 4 intelligence and hearsay, aren't they?  
 5 A. Like I say, sir, there's insufficient there in that  
 6 statement to put to the Crown Prosecution Service.  
 7 Q. Forgive me, I'm not suggesting you have a case to give  
 8 to the Crown Prosecution Service, but I'm asking have  
 9 you investigated it with Choudary because I would  
 10 suggest --  
 11 A. I have answered that question: no, sir, we didn't arrest  
 12 Anjem Choudary during this investigation.  
 13 Q. In July 2015, we have those activities that were  
 14 recorded in the Jihadis Next Door documentary?  
 15 A. Yes, sir.  
 16 Q. 31 July, I think; is that correct?  
 17 A. Yes.  
 18 Q. And many of those who he was associating with on those  
 19 occasions were themselves linked to ALM, Al-Muhajiroun,  
 20 would you agree?  
 21 A. Yes, sir.  
 22 Q. And Hamza Raza said that Butt would go on many  
 23 demonstrations. He would go on demonstrations to Luton,  
 24 he would go on demonstrations to Oxford Street, to the  
 25 Tottenham Court Road, all linked to ALM and the group

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1 associated with Choudary; that's right, isn't it?  
 2 A. I believe that's what Hamza Raza says.  
 3 Q. Press reports suggest that he would often campaign  
 4 alongside Choudary, including outside the Pakistan High  
 5 Commission and at other venues, and I think you've been  
 6 supplied with a number of press reports about this  
 7 topic, haven't you?  
 8 A. Yes, I have.  
 9 Q. Can you help with that? Is that believed to be correct;  
 10 that he would often campaign alongside Choudary at these  
 11 various locations?  
 12 A. I do not know enough in relation to those incidents,  
 13 sir.  
 14 Q. Another press report, and you've been provided with this  
 15 and we can have it on the screen if necessary, suggested  
 16 that he was alongside Choudary at a protest when  
 17 Choudary was defending the murder of Lee Rigby.  
 18 A. Again, I've seen the press reports, sir, but I don't  
 19 know enough about that case.  
 20 Q. Is that something you've been able to investigate?  
 21 A. I don't know, sir.  
 22 Q. But you told us that somebody who worked with Butt at  
 23 the organisation linked to KFC said that he made  
 24 a comment expressing sympathy for the Lee Rigby  
 25 murderers in the terms of speaking about an eye for

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1 an eye?  
 2 A. Yes, I believe one of his colleagues did say that.  
 3 Q. So Butt did appear to believe that there was a degree of  
 4 justification for that horrific murder?  
 5 A. Again, information obtained post-attack.  
 6 Q. Yes. Another press report which you've been provided  
 7 with, and again, we can have it on the screen if  
 8 necessary, suggests that Butt confronted Mohammed  
 9 Shafiq, who was an advocate engaged in  
 10 counter-extremism, and he criticised him and confronted  
 11 him because he had been describing Anjem Choudary as  
 12 being a traitor. You've seen that report?  
 13 A. I have, but again, sir, I don't know sufficient details  
 14 about that incident to make comments.  
 15 Q. As to whether that's correct or not?  
 16 A. No, I don't, sir.  
 17 Q. One of the people that you spoke to, Mr Iqbal, said that  
 18 Butt complained about women in the workplace, that was  
 19 something that he criticised; is that correct?  
 20 A. Again, yes, that's information we were provided.  
 21 Q. He criticised gay people and the -- gay people being all  
 22 around, the prevalence of gay people living their lives  
 23 openly in this country?  
 24 A. Yes, again, the information that was provided to us.  
 25 Q. And so these features of this ideology that you

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1 discovered in your investigation, these were, would you  
 2 agree, major criticisms of fundamental aspects of modern  
 3 British life, modern British society?  
 4 A. Yes, sir.  
 5 Q. That's part and parcel of his ideology, isn't it?  
 6 A. Like I say, sir, the information that we've been  
 7 provided points in that direction.  
 8 Q. Somebody that you spoke to who I think was his uncle was  
 9 Akhter Hussain; is that correct?  
 10 A. Yes, sir.  
 11 Q. And I think he told you and your colleagues that he  
 12 distanced himself from Butt because he regarded the  
 13 views that Butt held as being the views of a fanatic?  
 14 A. Yes, I believe he did distance himself from him.  
 15 Q. And that was the word he used?  
 16 A. Yes, that's the word he did.  
 17 Q. And, again, he thought he was somebody who had been  
 18 brainwashed -- that word again -- that's right, isn't  
 19 it?  
 20 A. Yes, sir.  
 21 Q. And he told his children not to associate with  
 22 Khuram Butt?  
 23 A. Correct.  
 24 Q. And he said this, and, again, we can go to the interview  
 25 if necessary. He said:

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1 "My way of life is that we live in Britain and we  
 2 have to abide by the law in this country."  
 3 A. That's what he told us during this interview, yes.  
 4 Q. So it's that same theme, isn't it, that emerges again  
 5 and again from the witnesses of whether you comply with  
 6 the way of life that we have in this country or whether  
 7 you don't?  
 8 A. Yes, sir.  
 9 Q. And Butt chose not to comply with it?  
 10 A. That appears to be his decision, yes.  
 11 Q. I'm sure, officer, in your investigations you've come  
 12 across something known as the "covenant of security"?  
 13 A. Yes, sir.  
 14 Q. Are you familiar with that term?  
 15 A. Yes, sir.  
 16 Q. And it's a term, isn't it, that often when interviewing  
 17 a terrorist suspect will be mentioned by the suspect  
 18 that as they try to explain that although they may say  
 19 certain things, that they believe that they should not  
 20 or could not attack within this country because there is  
 21 this principle that you should not launch an attack in  
 22 the country where you live?  
 23 A. Yes, sir.  
 24 Q. Perhaps you might summarise is rather differently, but  
 25 broadly speaking, that's what it focuses upon, isn't it?

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1 A. Yes. Yes, sir.  
 2 Q. Clearly Khuram Butt was of the view that there was no  
 3 covenant of security launching, as he did, this attack?  
 4 A. The evidence is there, sir: he carried out an attack.  
 5 Q. And what he was saying to people for many years was  
 6 consistent with that: that he did not recognise the  
 7 rules and the laws of this country?  
 8 A. Again, all that information we obtained post-attack.  
 9 Q. Updating the law of treason to cover betraying this  
 10 country is something that the Home Secretary recently  
 11 spoke about in a speech at New Scotland Yard, didn't he?  
 12 A. I believe he did, sir.  
 13 Q. I don't know whether you would have been present or not:  
 14 it was only a week or so ago.  
 15 A. I was not.  
 16 Q. But much of the conduct of Butt focuses on exactly that  
 17 issue, doesn't it: somebody choosing to put themselves  
 18 outside the rules and the obligations that we have in  
 19 this country; would you agree?  
 20 A. I'm not here to decide strategy/law around treason, sir,  
 21 that would be for somebody in government.  
 22 Q. Yes.  
 23 Fahad Khan, was he somebody you spoke to who knew  
 24 him from the Ummah Fitness Centre?  
 25 A. Yes, he was.

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1 Q. And again, I'll try to summarise. He told you that he  
 2 would complain about England, saying that the country  
 3 was wrong?  
 4 A. Yes, correct.  
 5 Q. That sharia law should be enforced?  
 6 A. Yes, I believe so. Like I say, I've read the statement  
 7 but I haven't got the details in front of me.  
 8 Q. That people who drink alcohol in bars are wrong,  
 9 something which is perhaps rather significant when we  
 10 think of the location of the attack at the Boro Bistro,  
 11 young people out enjoying themselves, drinking alcohol.  
 12 A. I don't know whether the Boro Bistro was targeted just  
 13 purely for that reason, sir, there's no evidence of  
 14 that.  
 15 Q. Those comments that he was making at the mosque, arguing  
 16 that the imam should not encourage people to participate  
 17 in the democratic process, that's something that  
 18 Adinan Abdulatif spoke about when he was spoken to by  
 19 your team, isn't it?  
 20 A. Yes.  
 21 Q. And he told you that two of the mosques from which he  
 22 was banned were the East Ham mosque and a second called  
 23 the Uthman mosque; is that correct?  
 24 A. Yes, that's correct.  
 25 Q. Have you been able to investigate the various mosques

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1 from which he was banned?  
 2 A. We made inquiries with some of the mosques, I can't  
 3 remember which ones, sir, but we made attempts to speak  
 4 with all of the mosques he was banned with.  
 5 Q. Can you help us for what other reasons there were for  
 6 him being banned from these mosques. We know that one  
 7 of them, at least, it was the participating in the  
 8 voting process. Can you help us with why he was banned  
 9 from other mosques?  
 10 A. I can't, not at the moment, sir, but I can maybe find  
 11 the answer out and give you the answer.  
 12 Q. That would be very helpful if you can find out. Is  
 13 there any record that you are aware of of any of these  
 14 mosques reporting him to the police or to the  
 15 authorities?  
 16 A. No, sir.  
 17 THE CHIEF CORONER: Mr Patterson, I've got one eye on the  
 18 clock. I'm conscious --  
 19 MR PATTERSON: Yes. That's as good a point as any.  
 20 THE CHIEF CORONER: -- I was going to say, I know you have  
 21 a number of topics you want to cover.  
 22 MR PATTERSON: I'm about to begin a different topic so ...  
 23 THE CHIEF CORONER: But if it fact it would help you if the  
 24 particular topic you have just been covering about the  
 25 mosques, it may well be that Mr Jolley can check those,

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1 because I think tomorrow morning we're going to turn to  
2 some different evidence first thing, and we'll pick up  
3 on this topic probably, I suspect, tomorrow afternoon.  
4 MR HOUGH: We're hopeful that the other witnesses tomorrow  
5 can be finished within the morning, so that we may  
6 return to Mr Jolley towards the end of the morning.  
7 THE CHIEF CORONER: Yes.  
8 MR PATTERSON: Certainly.  
9 THE CHIEF CORONER: Very well, we will pause there.  
10 Mr Jolley, I'm conscious you have been fired all  
11 sorts of different questions on different topics and  
12 I'm sure Mr Patterson won't mind, in fact, if you want  
13 to just check details with him over things that you  
14 would like you to look at so that you are in a position  
15 to answer, where you can, the topics that he has  
16 covered.  
17 A. Yes, sir, thank you.  
18 MR HOUGH: Sir, just before you rise, I presume it is also  
19 acceptable for Mr Jolley to consult with his colleagues  
20 both over this break and over any other breaks in order  
21 to be able to provide additional assistance given the  
22 nature of his evidence.  
23 THE CHIEF CORONER: I think -- I see nods of approval for  
24 that from both Mr Adamson and Mr Patterson. I would  
25 welcome that, simply because I'm conscious that there's

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1 a whole wealth of material which not only this officer  
2 has investigated but the others that have been working  
3 with him, and it would be unfair to put him on the spot  
4 where somebody else has the answer at their fingertips,  
5 and I am sure that would be welcomed.  
6 So tomorrow morning, Mr Hough, we'll sit at  
7 10 o'clock. We will deal with -- I think we have three  
8 pathologists coming --  
9 MR HOUGH: Three pathologists plus one other witness, and  
10 then back to Mr Jolley.  
11 THE CHIEF CORONER: Mr Patterson, I know you've got quite  
12 a bit of material to cover, but just in terms of our  
13 planning for later in the week, do you think if you  
14 have, as it were, part of tomorrow morning and tomorrow  
15 afternoon, that will be sufficient?  
16 MR PATTERSON: Yes, I've spoken with Mr Hough. We should  
17 conclude all of the witnesses timetabled for this week.  
18 I don't see a need to trouble your Lordship with  
19 a request to sit late or anything like that. Hopefully  
20 we can conclude things and I'm told that if necessary we  
21 can even go into Friday afternoon, although I don't want  
22 to make myself unpopular.  
23 THE CHIEF CORONER: Friday afternoon is always a good time  
24 to get things done. It concentrates the mind, I find,  
25 Mr Patterson.

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1 MR PATTERSON: Absolutely. Absolutely.  
2 THE CHIEF CORONER: I will rise.  
3 (4.27 pm)
