

**INQUESTS ARISING FROM THE DEATHS IN THE  
LONDON BRIDGE AND BOROUGH MARKET  
TERROR ATTACK OF 3 JUNE 2017**

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**SUPPLEMENTARY SUBMISSIONS ON DETERMINATIONS  
IN RESPONSE TO SUPPLEMENTARY SUBMISSIONS  
ON BEHALF OF THE SIX FAMILIES  
MADE ON BEHALF OF THE LONDON AMBULANCE SERVICE**

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1. The LAS provides these brief supplementary submissions on narrative determinations in response to the supplementary submissions from the families dated 26 June 2019.
  
2. The LAS would have no objection to the following forms of words in relation to Alexandre Pigeard and Kirsty Boden respectively:
  - a. *“Alexandre received treatment from a police officer, who went to treat the injured regardless of any risk to himself but rightly concluded that Alexandre could not be saved and went to attend other victims. At 1.07am on 4 June, he was confirmed as dead by a paramedic.”*
  - b. *“Kirsty received treatment from friends, members of the public, police officers and an off duty doctor who went to treat the injured regardless of any risk to themselves. At 10.23pm the doctor pronounced life extinct. At 1.12am on 4 June Kirsty was confirmed as dead at the scene by a paramedic.”*
  
3. In relation to the suggested formulations in respect of Sebastien Belanger and James McMullan the LAS’s position is set out in their written submissions at paragraphs 29 to 35. Essentially, there is no objection to the suggested amendments except in relation to the words *“... and not knowing that there were ambulances close by.”* which is submitted should not be included for the reasons set out thereto and by CTI in oral submissions today.

4. The reasons for the suggested formulations can be addressed further in oral submissions if necessary.
